<b>all</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>A <b>totally</b> new situation.</i>
<b><a href="#">almost</a></b>	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>The baby was <b>almost</b> asleep when the alarm sounded.</i>
<b>always</b>	Without interruption. <i>The sun <b>always</b> rises in the east.</i>
<b><a href="#">anyhow</a></b>	In a careless or haphazard way. <i>I think they re asleep <b>anyhow</b> they re quiet.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i><b>Constantly</b> kind and gracious.</i>
<b><a href="#">continually</a></b>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The <b>continued</b> popularity of Westerns.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	Without interruption or gaps. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">daily</a></b>	Of or belonging to or occurring every day. <i>A <b>daily</b> paper.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An <b>endless</b> conversation.</i>
<b><a href="#">endlessly</a></b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged Bacon. <i>Was able to keep the collection <b>entire</b> during his lifetime.</i>

<b>entirety</b>	The whole of something. <i>She would have to stay in her room for the <b>entirety</b> of the weekend.</i>
<b>ever</b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> the man of action he was impatient with intellectuals.</i>
<b>forever</b>	A very long time (used hyperbolically). <i>They are <b>forever</b> on the move.</i>
<b>frequently</b>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>infinitely</b>	Continuing forever without end. <i>There are issues here that could be expanded <b>infinitely</b>.</i>
<b>invariably</b>	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>long</b>	Of elongated shape. <i>The Cambridge side played the ball <b>long</b>.</i>
<b>nearly</b>	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>In the absence of anyone more <b>nearly</b> related I was designated next of kin.</i>
<b>occasionally</b>	At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then. <i>Very <b>occasionally</b> the condition can result in death.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Everlastingly; for all time- Stuart Chase. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Never-ceasing. <i><b>Persistent</b> reports of human rights abuses by the military.</i>
<b>steadily</b>	At a steady rate or pace. <i>The business has been growing <b>steadily</b>.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>unlimited</b>	Without reservation or exception. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not <b>unlimited</b>.</i>
<b>weekly</b>	A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year). <i>The difference in <b>weekly</b> income is 29 10.</i>
