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Associations of "Every" (30 Words)

all	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>A totally new situation.</i>
almost	(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>The baby was almost asleep when the alarm sounded.</i>
always	Without interruption. <i>The sun always rises in the east.</i>
anyhow	In a careless or haphazard way. <i>I think they re asleep anyhow they re quiet.</i>
constantly	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>Constantly kind and gracious.</i>
continually	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continued	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The continued popularity of Westerns.</i>
continuously	Without interruption or gaps. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
daily	Of or belonging to or occurring every day. <i>A daily paper.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An endless conversation.</i>
endlessly	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were endlessly repeated.</i>
entire	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged Bacon. <i>Was able to keep the collection entire during his lifetime.</i>

entirety	The whole of something. <i>She would have to stay in her room for the entirety of the weekend.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Ever the man of action he was impatient with intellectuals.</i>
forever	A very long time (used hyperbolically). <i>They are forever on the move.</i>
frequently	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad frequently.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
infinitely	Continuing forever without end. <i>There are issues here that could be expanded infinitely.</i>
invariably	In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i>
long	Of elongated shape. <i>The Cambridge side played the ball long.</i>
nearly	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>In the absence of anyone more nearly related I was designated next of kin.</i>
occasionally	At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then. <i>Very occasionally the condition can result in death.</i>
perpetual	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
perpetually	Everlastingly; for all time- Stuart Chase. <i>She seems perpetually to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
persistent	Never-ceasing. <i>Persistent reports of human rights abuses by the military.</i>
steadily	At a steady rate or pace. <i>The business has been growing steadily.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
weekly	A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year). <i>The difference in weekly income is 29 10.</i>
