- *Appropriate for ordinary or routine occasions.*
- *Happening or used every day; daily.*
- *Commonplace and ordinary.*



## Synonyms of "Everyday" as an adjective (19 Words)

### casual

Done or acting without sufficient care or thoroughness.  
*An ideal coat for **casual** occasions.*

### **common**

Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual.  
*The **common** gull.*

### **commonplace**

Completely ordinary and unremarkable.  
*His remarks were trite and **commonplace**.*

### **conventional**

Following accepted customs and proprieties.  
***Conventional** attitudes.*

### daily

Done, produced, or occurring every day or every weekday.  
*A **daily** newspaper.*

<b>familiar</b>	Often encountered or experienced; common. <i><b>Familiar</b> with the complex machinery.</i>
<b>mundane</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>His <b>mundane</b> humdrum existence.</i>
<b>ordinary</b>	With no special or distinctive features; normal. <i>The <b>ordinary</b> or common man in the street.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Denoting or relating to a type of knitting stitch produced by putting the needle through the front of each stitch from left to right. <i>Made his meaning <b>plain</b>.</i>
<b>quotidian</b>	Denoting the malignant form of malaria. <i>The car sped noisily off through the <b>quotidian</b> traffic.</i>
<b>regular</b>	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>Egg pasta is richer than <b>regular</b> pasta.</i>
<b>routine</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>It was a <b>routine</b> day.</i>
<b>run-of-the-mill</b>	Not special in any way.
<b>standard</b>	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i><b>Standard</b> procedure.</i>
<b>stock</b>	Of a product or type of product usually kept in stock and thus regularly available for sale. <i>A <b>stock</b> item.</i>
<b>typical</b>	Showing the characteristics expected of or popularly associated with a particular person or thing. <i>A <b>typical</b> example of 1930s art deco.</i>
<b>unremarkable</b>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>An <b>unremarkable</b> house.</i>
<b>usual</b>	Occurring or encountered or experienced or observed frequently or in accordance with regular practice or procedure. <i>Grew the <b>usual</b> vegetables.</i>
<b>workaday</b>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>Your humble <b>workaday</b> PC.</i>
