Synonyms of "Everyday" as an adjective (19 Words)

casual

Done or acting without sufficient care or thoroughness.

*An ideal coat for **casual** occasions.*

common

Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual.

*The **common** gull.*

commonplace

Completely ordinary and unremarkable.

*His remarks were trite and **commonplace**.*

conventional

Following accepted customs and proprieties.

***Conventional** attitudes.*

daily

Done, produced, or occurring every day or every weekday.

*A **daily** newspaper.*

<u>familiar</u>	Often encountered or experienced; common. <i>Familiar with the complex machinery.</i>
<u>mundane</u>	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>His mundane humdrum existence.</i>
ordinary	With no special or distinctive features; normal. <i>The ordinary or common man in the street.</i>
plain	Denoting or relating to a type of knitting stitch produced by putting the needle through the front of each stitch from left to right. <i>Made his meaning plain.</i>
quotidian	Denoting the malignant form of malaria. <i>The car sped noisily off through the quotidian traffic.</i>
regular	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>Egg pasta is richer than regular pasta.</i>
routine	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>It was a routine day.</i>
run-of-the-mill	Not special in any way.
standard	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>Standard procedure.</i>
<u>stock</u>	Of a product or type of product usually kept in stock and thus regularly available for sale. <i>A stock item.</i>
<u>typical</u>	Showing the characteristics expected of or popularly associated with a particular person or thing. <i>A typical example of 1930s art deco.</i>
<u>unremarkable</u>	Not particularly interesting or surprising. <i>An unremarkable house.</i>
<u>usual</u>	Occurring or encountered or experienced or observed frequently or in accordance with regular practice or procedure. <i>Grew the usual vegetables.</i>
workaday	Found in the ordinary course of events. <i>Your humble workaday PC.</i>
