<b><u>apparent</u></b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>The effects of the drought are <b>apparent</b> to anyone who sees the parched fields.</i>
<b><u>blatant</u></b>	Completely lacking in subtlety; very obvious. <i><b>Blatant</b> radios.</i>
<b><u>clear</u></b>	Clear of charges or deductions. <i>After 18 months of treatment he was <b>clear</b> of TB.</i>
<b>clear-cut</b>	Clear and distinct to the senses; easily perceptible.
<b><u>conspicuous</u></b>	Obvious to the eye or mind. <i>A tower <b>conspicuous</b> at a great distance.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>The scandal had no <b>discernible</b> effect on his career.</i>
<b>distinct</b>	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind. <i>Plants of several <b>distinct</b> types.</i>

<b>glaring</b>	Highly obvious or conspicuous. <i>Their <b>glaring</b> eyes.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Walked with a <b>marked</b> limp.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A <b>noticeable</b> lack of friendliness.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>
<b>palpable</b>	(of a feeling or atmosphere) so intense as to seem almost tangible. <i>Felt sudden anger in a <b>palpable</b> wave.</i>
<b>patent</b>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>The patient is usually left with a <b>patent</b> vessel.</i>
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily seen or detected. <i>Easily <b>perceptible</b> sounds.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Without a pattern; in only one colour. <i>It was <b>plain</b> that something was wrong.</i>
<b>pronounced</b>	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<b>striking</b>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>A <b>striking</b> thing about Picadilly Circus is the statue of Eros in the center.</i>
<b>tangible</b>	Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch. <i>The emphasis is now on <b>tangible</b> results.</i>
<b>transparent</b>	Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. <i><b>Transparent</b> chiffon.</i>
<b>unmistakable</b>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>The <b>unmistakable</b> sound of his laughter.</i>
<b>visible</b>	Present and easily available. <i>A <b>visible</b> change of expression.</i>

<b><u>apparent</u></b>	Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so. <i>The effects of the drought are <b>apparent</b> to anyone who sees the parched fields.</i>
<b><u>apparently</u></b>	As far as one knows or can see. <i>I thought he owned the property but <b>apparently</b> not.</i>
<b><u>assuredly</u></b>	Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	Without doubt; obviously. <i>I could <b>clearly</b> see myself in his situation.</i>
<b><u>conspicuous</u></b>	Attracting notice or attention. <i>Made herself <b>conspicuous</b> by her exhibitionistic preening.</i>
<b>detectable</b>	Easily seen or detected. <i>Yvette responded finally her French accent barely <b>detectable</b>.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>An essay with a meaning that was not always <b>discernible</b>.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	(used for emphasis) in a way that is very noticeable or apparent; decidedly. <i>Two <b>distinctly</b> different cultures.</i>
<b><u>evidently</u></b>	In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously. <i>A work so <b>evidently</b> laden with significance.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>

<b>identifiable</b>	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i><b>Indubitably</b> liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having been adjusted so that the print fills a space evenly or forms a straight line at the margin. <i>The doctors were <b>justified</b> in treating her.</i>
<u><b>manifest</b></u>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>The word <b>drake</b> is semantically <b>marked</b> as masculine.</i>
<u><b>noticeable</b></u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a <b>noticeable</b> pause the lecturer continued.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>She was <b>obviously</b> unwell.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>He continued after a <b>perceptible</b> pause.</i>
<b>perspicuous</b>	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more <b>perspicuous</b> explanations than its rivals.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>The advantages were <b>plain</b> to see.</i>
<u><b>preeminent</b></u>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.</i>
<b>pronounced</b>	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>He had a <b>pronounced</b> squint.</i>
<b>rightly</b>	With honesty. <i>If I remember <b>rightly</b> she never gives interviews.</i>
<u><b>seemingly</b></u>	From appearances alone. <i>It's touch and go <b>seemingly</b> and she's asking for you.</i>
<u><b>undoubtedly</b></u>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>
