apparent	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>The effects of the drought are apparent to anyone who sees the parched fields.</i>
blatant	Completely lacking in subtlety; very obvious. <i>Blatant radios.</i>
clear	Clear of charges or deductions. <i>After 18 months of treatment he was clear of TB.</i>
clear-cut	Clear and distinct to the senses; easily perceptible.
conspicuous	Obvious to the eye or mind. <i>A tower conspicuous at a great distance.</i>
discernible	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>The scandal had no discernible effect on his career.</i>
distinct	Clearly or sharply defined to the mind. <i>Plants of several distinct types.</i>

<u>glaring</u>	Highly obvious or conspicuous. <i>Their glaring eyes.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>Walked with a marked limp.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A noticeable lack of friendliness.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
<u>palpable</u>	(of a feeling or atmosphere) so intense as to seem almost tangible. <i>Felt sudden anger in a palpable wave.</i>
<u>patent</u>	Made and marketed under a patent proprietary. <i>The patient is usually left with a patent vessel.</i>
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>
perceptible	Easily seen or detected. <i>Easily perceptible sounds.</i>
plain	Without a pattern; in only one colour. <i>It was plain that something was wrong.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<u>striking</u>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>A striking thing about Picadilly Circus is the statue of Eros in the center.</i>
<u>tangible</u>	Perceptible by the senses especially the sense of touch. <i>The emphasis is now on tangible results.</i>
<u>transparent</u>	Transmitting light; able to be seen through with clarity. <i>Transparent chiffon.</i>
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>The unmistakable sound of his laughter.</i>
<u>visible</u>	Present and easily available. <i>A visible change of expression.</i>

*The effects of the drought are **apparent** to anyone who sees the parched fields.*
- apparently** As far as one knows or can see.
*I thought he owned the property but **apparently** not.*
- assuredly** Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true.
*Potted roses will most **assuredly** not survive winter without protection.*
- clearly** Without doubt; obviously.
*I could **clearly** see myself in his situation.*
- conspicuous** Attracting notice or attention.
*Made herself **conspicuous** by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- detectable** Easily seen or detected.
*Yvette responded finally her French accent barely **detectable**.*
- discernible** Able to be discerned; perceptible.
*An essay with a meaning that was not always **discernible**.*
- distinctly** (used for emphasis) in a way that is very noticeable or apparent; decidedly.
*Two **distinctly** different cultures.*
- evidently** In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously.
*A work so **evidently** laden with significance.*
- expressly** Explicitly; clearly.
*The house was **expressly** built for entertaining.*

identifiable	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
justified	Having been adjusted so that the print fills a space evenly or forms a straight line at the margin. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
manifest	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>The word drake is semantically marked as masculine.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>After a noticeable pause the lecturer continued.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Obvious errors.</i>
obviously	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>She was obviously unwell.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>He continued after a perceptible pause.</i>
perspicuous	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more perspicuous explanations than its rivals.</i>
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>The advantages were plain to see.</i>
preeminent	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A preeminent archeologist.</i>
pronounced	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>He had a pronounced squint.</i>
rightly	With honesty. <i>If I remember rightly she never gives interviews.</i>
seemingly	From appearances alone. <i>It's touch and go seemingly and she's asking for you.</i>
undoubtedly	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are undoubtedly guilty.</i>
