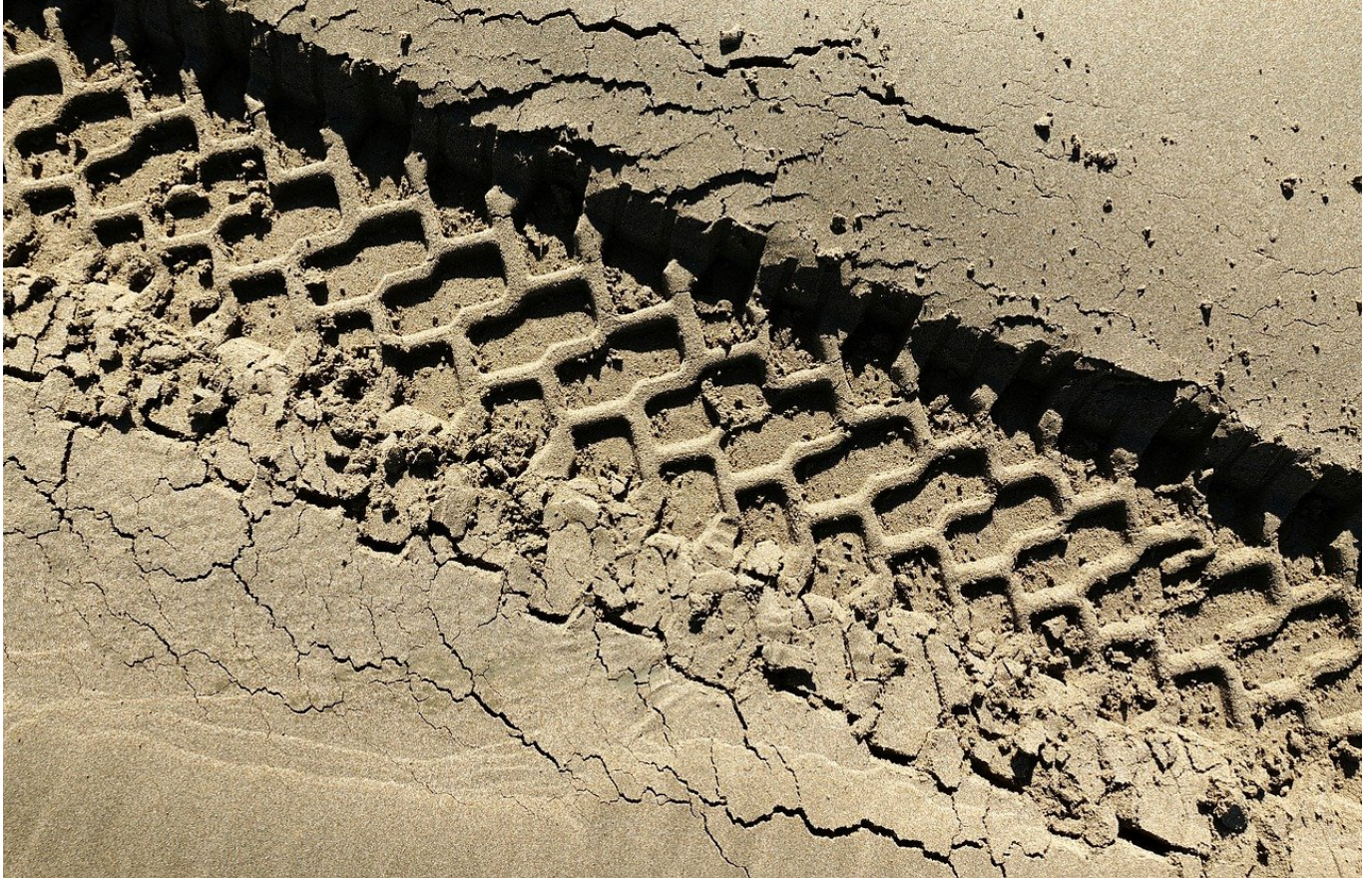

## Evidently as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Evidently" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “evidently” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Used as an affirmative response.*
- *In a way that is clearly seen or understood; obviously.*
- *Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly).*
- *Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly).*
- *It would seem that.*



## Synonyms of "Evidently" as an adverb (21 Words)

**[apparently](#)**

From appearances alone.

*Irrigation often produces bumper crops from **apparently** desert land.*

**as far as one can tell**

To the same degree (often followed by `as).

**[blatantly](#)**

In an open and unashamed manner.

*It s **blatantly** her first kiss.*

**clearly**

In an intelligible manner.

*Her ability to write **clearly**.*

**distinctly**

To a distinct degree.

*Reading each word slowly and **distinctly**.*

**from all appearances**

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (`whole' is often used informally for `wholly).

**manifestly**

In a way that is clear or obvious to the eye or mind.

*He was **manifestly** too important to leave off the guest list.*

<b>markedly</b>	To an extent which is clearly noticeable; significantly. <i>New diagnoses have increased <b>markedly</b> since 1998.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably ('plain' is often used informally for 'plainly'). <b>Obviously</b> everyone has to do what they think is right.
<b>ostensibly</b>	As appears or is stated to be true, though not necessarily so; apparently. <i>Had been <b>ostensibly</b> frank as to his purpose while really concealing it.</i>
<b>outwardly</b>	In outward appearance. <i>An <b>outwardly</b> normal life.</i>
<b>palpably</b>	In a way that is able to be touched or felt. <i>The audience became <b>palpably</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>patently</b>	Clearly; without doubt. <i>These claims were <b>patently</b> false.</i>
<b>perceptibly</b>	In a noticeable manner.
<b>plain</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>You are <b>plainly</b> wrong.</i>
<b>plainly</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>To speak <b>plainly</b> I suffer from a lack of confidence.</i>
<b>seemingly</b>	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. <i>The child is <b>seemingly</b> healthy but the doctor is concerned.</i>
<b>so it seems to all intents and purposes</b>	In the way indicated; ('thusly' is a nonstandard variant). To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent ('whole' is often used informally for 'wholly').
<b>transparently</b>	(with reference to a process) without the user being aware. <i>The job of streaming data to the receiver is handled <b>transparently</b> by a server program.</i>
<b>visibly</b>	So as to be visible. <i>The defendant paled <b>visibly</b> as the guilty verdict was announced.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Evidently" as an adverb

- *A work so evidently laden with significance.*
- *'Were they old pals or something?' 'Evidently.'*
- *She was in bed and evidently in great pain.*
- *Evidently Mrs Smith thought differently.*



## Associations of "Evidently" (30 Words)

<b><u>apparent</u></b>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>The effects of the drought are <b>apparent</b> to anyone who sees the parched fields.</i>
<b><u>apparently</u></b>	From appearances alone. <i>She has <b>apparently</b> been living here for some time.</i>
<b><u>assuredly</u></b>	Without a doubt. <i>The lad kept his cool and <b>assuredly</b> slipped the ball between the posts.</i>
<b><u>certainly</u></b>	Definitely or positively ('sure' is sometimes used informally for 'surely'). <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<b><u>certainty</u></b>	A fact that is definitely true or an event that is definitely going to take place. <i>A man exuding <b>certainty</b>.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i><b>Clearly</b> things have changed in the last six weeks.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Undoubtedly; undeniably. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>

<b><u>definite</u></b>	(of a person) certain or sure about something. <i>Organizations have boundaries in the sense that they may occupy a <b>definite</b> geographical area.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more <b>definitely</b>.</i>
<b>determinate</b>	Having exact and discernible limits or form. <i>The longest <b>determinate</b> prison sentence ever upheld by English courts.</i>
<b><u>doubtless</u></b>	Presumably or very probably. <i>The company would <b>doubtless</b> find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>
<b>effortless</b>	Requiring or apparently requiring no effort. <i>Each skill is practised to the point that it becomes <b>effortless</b>.</i>
<b><u>evident</u></b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>A clearly <b>evident</b> erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having been adjusted so that the print fills a space evenly or forms a straight line at the margin. <i>The output is left <b>justified</b>.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A <b>marked</b> increase in UK sales.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	To an extent which is clearly noticeable; significantly. <i>This advice is <b>markedly</b> different to that last year.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>The answer is <b>obviously</b> wrong.</i>
<b>plain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>I'm finished with you I'll tell you <b>plain</b>.</i>
<b>positively</b>	In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or acceptance. <i>It was <b>positively</b> monumental.</i>
<b>rightly</b>	With honesty. <i>The key <b>rightly</b> belonged to Craig.</i>
<b><u>seemingly</u></b>	So as to give the impression of having a certain quality; apparently. <i>It's touch and go <b>seemingly</b> and she's asking for you.</i>

- sure** Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured.  
*He ll win **sure** as shooting.*
- surely** Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.  
*If he did not heed the warning he would **surely** die.*
- truly** In a truthful way.  
*A **truly** awful book.*
- undoubtedly** Without doubt; certainly.  
*It s **undoubtedly** very beautiful.*
- uneasily** With anxiety or apprehension.  
*The men glanced **uneasily** at each other.*
- unequivocal** Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.  
*The plain and **unequivocal** language of the laws.*
- unquestionably** Without question.  
***Unquestionably** the loss of his father was a grievous blow.*
