<b>absolutely</b>	None whatsoever. <i>An <b>absolutely</b> magnificent painting.</i>
<b>accurately</b>	With few mistakes. <i>Every single vote was <b>accurately</b> counted.</i>
<b><u>assuredly</u></b>	Used to express the speaker's certainty that something is true. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>
<b><u>certainly</u></b>	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>She <b>certainly</b> is a hard worker.</i>
<b>completely</b>	So as to be complete; with everything necessary. <i>You must be <b>completely</b> mad.</i>
<b><u>correctly</u></b>	In an accurate manner. <i>She had acted <b>correctly</b>.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>

<b>entirely</b>	Without any others being included or involved. <i>We have an <b>entirely</b> different outlook.</i>
<b>faultlessly</b>	Without a fault; in a faultless manner.
<b>in every respect</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in every way</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>incisively</b>	In a precise manner.
<b><u>indeed</u></b>	Used to emphasize a statement or response confirming something already suggested. <i>The idea is attractive to many men and <b>indeed</b> to many women.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b><u>just</u></b>	Possibly (used to indicate a slight chance of something happening or being true). <i>That s <b>just</b> what I need.</i>
<b>just so</b>	Only a very short time before.
<b>perfectly</b>	Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers. <i>The ring fitted <b>perfectly</b>.</i>
<b>precisely</b>	Exactly (used to emphasize the complete accuracy or truth of a statement). <i>She always expressed herself <b>precisely</b>.</i>
<b><u>properly</u></b>	In the strict sense; exactly. <i>I m trying to get my mother to behave <b>properly</b>.</i>
<b><u>quite</u></b>	Actually or truly or to an extreme. <i>Are you <b>quite</b> certain about this.</i>
<b>quite so</b>	Actually or truly or to an extreme.
<b>right</b>	On or to the right side. <i>The car spun <b>right</b> off the track.</i>
<b>that's right to the hilt</b>	Very; to a great degree. In full.
<b><u>totally</u></b>	Used to emphasize a clause or statement. <i>I m sorry I <b>totally</b> didn t mean it.</i>
<b><u>truly</u></b>	Loyally or faithfully. <i>This is <b>truly</b> a miracle.</i>
<b><u>undoubtedly</u></b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Exactly" as an adverb

- *'You mean that you're going to tell me the truth?' 'Exactly.'*
- *They met in 1989 and got married exactly two years later.*
- *What exactly are you looking for?*
- *He was doing precisely (or exactly) what she had told him to do.*

- accurate** Of an instrument or method capable of giving accurate information.  
***Accurate** information about the illness is essential.*
- accurately** In a way that is correct in all details; exactly.  
*We are simply unable to predict long term trends **accurately**.*
- correct** Correct in opinion or judgment.  
*Cut the top and bottom tracks to the **correct** length with a hacksaw.*
- correctly** In a way that is true, factual or appropriate; accurately.  
*She had acted **correctly**.*
- correspond** Communicate by exchanging letters, emails, or other messages.  
*The doctor and I **corresponded** for more than two decades.*

<b>defined</b>	Clearly characterized or delimited. <i>A number of clearly <b>defined</b> aims.</i>
<b>detail</b>	Provide details for. <i>A <b>detail</b> on Charlemagne s tomb.</i>
<b>detailed</b>	Developed or executed with care and in minute detail- John Buchan. <i>An exquisitely <b>detailed</b> carving.</i>
<b><u>exact</u></b>	(of a person) accurate and careful about minor details. <i>She was an <b>exact</b> clever manager.</i>
<b>exactitude</b>	The quality of being exact. <i>He writes with <b>exactitude</b> and precision.</i>
<b>factually</b>	As a fact or based on fact. <i>The evidence is legally and <b>factually</b> insufficient.</i>
<b>justly</b>	In accordance with moral or social standards. <i>We can <b>justly</b> be proud of our achievements.</i>
<b>justness</b>	The quality of being just or fair. <i>It was performed with <b>justness</b> and beauty.</i>
<b>literally</b>	Used for emphasis while not being literally true. <i>Our eyes were <b>literally</b> pinned to TV during the Gulf War.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>The word drake is semantically <b>marked</b> as masculine.</i>
<b><u>meticulous</u></b>	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i><b>Meticulous</b> research.</i>
<b><u>perusal</u></b>	The action of reading or examining something. <i>I continued my <b>perusal</b> of the instructions.</i>
<b>pinpoint</b>	A very brief moment. <i>One flare had <b>pinpointed</b> the target.</i>
<b><u>precise</u></b>	Characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth ; strictly correct. <i>The director was <b>precise</b> with his camera positions.</i>
<b>precisely</b>	Exactly (used to emphasize the complete accuracy or truth of a statement. <i>She always expressed herself <b>precisely</b>.</i>
<b><u>precision</u></b>	Refinement in a measurement, calculation, or specification, especially as represented by the number of digits given. <i>Note the meticulous <b>precision</b> of his measurements.</i>
<b>reliably</b>	In a faithful manner. <i>Few of these paintings can be <b>reliably</b> dated.</i>
<b>rightness</b>	Appropriate conduct; doing the right thing. <i>The <b>rightness</b> of that move for me.</i>

- scrupulous** Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled.  
*Scrupulous attention to details.*
- solvable** Capable of being solved.  
*Such problems are perfectly **solvable**.*
- truly** Loyally or faithfully.  
*He speaks **truly**.*
- veracious** Precisely accurate.  
*A **veracious** account.*
- verbatim** In exactly the same words as were used originally.  
*Your quotations must be **verbatim**.*
- wording** The manner in which something is expressed in words.  
*The standard form of **wording** for a consent letter.*
