- Used to emphasize the accuracy of a figure or description.
- Indicating exactness or preciseness.



exact (of a person) accurate and careful about minor details.

She was an **exact** clever manager.

exactitude The quality of being exact.

He writes with **exactitude** and precision.

factually As a fact or based on fact.

The evidence is legally and **factually** insufficient.

justly

In accordance with moral or social standards.

We can justly be proud of our achievements.

we can **justiy** be proud of our achieve

justness The quality of being just or fair.

It was performed with justness and beauty.

Used for emphasis while not being literally true.

Our eyes were **literally** pinned to TV during the Gulf War.

marked Strongly marked easily noticeable.

The word drake is semantically **marked** as masculine.

Marked by precise accordance with details.

meticulous Meticulous research.

The action of reading or examining something.

I continued my **perusal** of the instructions.

pinpoint A very brief moment.

One flare had **pinpoint**ed the target.

Characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct.

The director was **precise** with his camera positions.

precisely Exactly (used to emphasize the complete accuracy or truth of a statement.

She always expressed herself **precisely**.

Refinement in a measurement, calculation, or specification, especially as

precision represented by the number of digits given.

Note the meticulous **precision** of his measurements.

reliably In a faithful manner.

Few of these paintings can be **reliably** dated.

rightness Appropriate conduct; doing the right thing.

The **rightness** of that move for me.



scrupulous Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled.

Scrupulous attention to details.

solvable Capable of being solved.

Such problems are perfectly solvable.

Loyally or faithfully.

He speaks truly.

veracious Precisely accurate.

A **veracious** account.

verbatim In exactly the same words as were used originally.

Your quotations must be **verbatim**.

wording The manner in which something is expressed in words.

The standard form of **wording** for a consent letter.
