outrun	Run faster than. It s harder than anyone imagines to outrun destiny.
outstanding	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. The team s outstanding performance.
outstrip	Exceed. During the morning warm up he once again outstrip ped the field.
outwit	Beat through cleverness and wit. Ray had outwit ted many an opponent.
overreach	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. <i>The Church</i> overreach ed itself in securing a territory that would prove impossible to hold.
overstep	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries. You must not overstep your borrowing limit.
<u>overtake</u>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>He overtook in the face of oncoming traffic.</i>
<u>phenomenal</u>	Perceptible by the senses or through immediate experience. The phenomenal world.
rushing	The action of gaining yardage or scoring a touchdown or conversion by running from scrimmage with the ball. <i>He is becoming the best</i> rushing <i>quarterback in NFL history.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e g superb lyrebird. A superb performance.
superior	A superior letter figure or symbol. A superior officer.
<u>surpass</u>	Distinguish oneself. One line of soldiers surpass ed the other.
surpassing	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. A picture of surpassing beauty.
transcend	Be greater in scope or size than some standard. This was an issue transcend ing party politics.
transcendent	(of God) existing apart from and not subject to the limitations of the material universe. The notion of any transcendent reality beyond thought.
<u>transgress</u>	Act in disregard of laws, rules, contracts, or promises. Each continent has been transgress ed by continental seas.
