ace	In tennis and similar games serve an ace against an opponent. <i>An ace reporter.</i>
better	Make something better improve. <i>You re a better man than I am Gunga Din.</i>
calibre	Diameter of a tube or gun barrel. <i>A small calibre revolver.</i>
exalted	Of a noble, elevated, or lofty nature. <i>I felt exalted and newly alive.</i>
exceed	Go beyond what is allowed or stipulated by (a set limit). <i>Their loyalty exceeds their national bonds.</i>
excellent	Extremely good; outstanding. <i>Made an excellent speech.</i>
exemplary	Being or serving as an illustration of a type. <i>An action exemplary of his conduct.</i>
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>He has a fine eye for the detail and texture of social scenery.</i>
innately	As an inborn characteristic; naturally. <i>Innately flawed policies.</i>
outdistance	Go far ahead of. <i>She could maintain a fast enough pace to outdistance any pursuers.</i>
outdo	Be superior to in action or performance. <i>She outdoes all other athletes.</i>
outpace	Go, rise, or improve faster than. <i>Import growth outpaced export growth in the second quarter.</i>
outrun	Escape from. <i>It s harder than anyone imagines to outrun destiny.</i>

outstanding	Owed as a debt. Outstanding bills.
outstrip	Move faster than and overtake (someone else). <i>During the morning warm up he once again outstripped the field.</i>
outwit	Deceive by greater ingenuity. <i>Ray had outwitted many an opponent.</i>
overreach	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. <i>Faustus's lunacy in thinking he can overreach the devil.</i>
overstep	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>You must not overstep your borrowing limit.</i>
<u>overtake</u>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Weariness overtook him and he retired to bed.</i>
<u>phenomenal</u>	Remarkable or exceptional, especially exceptionally good. Phenomenal feats of memory.
rushing	The action of advancing rapidly towards an opposing player, especially the quarterback. <i>There is no defensive rushing allowed during the kick.</i>
superb	Used in names of birds with attractive or colourful plumage e.g superb lyrebird. <i>A superb meal.</i>
superior	Of high or superior quality or performance. <i>He is superior to fear.</i>
<u>surpass</u>	Do or be better than ever before. <i>Pre war levels of production were surpassed in 1929.</i>
surpassing	Exceeding or surpassing usual limits especially in excellence. <i>A picture of surpassing beauty.</i>
transcend	Surpass (a person or achievement). <i>This was an issue transcending party politics.</i>
transcendent	Beyond or above the range of normal or physical human experience. <i>Her transcendent beauty.</i>
<u>transgress</u>	Go beyond the limits of (what is morally, socially, or legally acceptable). <i>She had transgressed an unwritten social law.</i>
<u>unsurpassed</u>	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
victor	A code word representing the letter V, used in radio communication. <i>Congratulations to the victors.</i>
