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
**The synonyms of “Exclamation” are: ecphothesis, exclaiming, cry, call, shout, yell, shriek, roar, bellow, interjection**

## **Exclamation as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Exclamation" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “exclamation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A sudden cry or remark expressing surprise, strong emotion, or pain.*
- *An exclamatory rhetorical device.*
- *An abrupt excited utterance.*
- *A loud complaint or protest or reproach.*



**Synonyms of "Exclamation" as a noun (10 Words)**

<b>bellow</b>	A very loud utterance (like the sound of an animal). <i>A <b>bellow</b> of rage.</i>
<b>call</b>	A direction in a square dance given by the caller. <i>The alternative <b>call</b> of 2 would be quite unsound.</i>
<b>cry</b>	A pack of hounds. <i>I still have a <b>cry</b> sometimes when I realize that my mother is dead.</i>
<b>ecphonesis</b>	An exclamatory rhetorical device.
<b>exclaiming</b>	An abrupt excited utterance. <i>There was much <b>exclaiming</b> over it.</i>
<b>interjection</b>	The action of interjecting or interposing an action or remark that interrupts. <i>Barracking and <b>interjections</b> from the protesters.</i>
<b>roar</b>	A deep prolonged loud noise. <i>Her remarks brought a <b>roar</b> of laughter from the old man.</i>
<b>shout</b>	A call-out for one of the emergency services. <i>His words were interrupted by warning <b>shouts</b>.</i>
<b>shriek</b>	An exclamation mark. <i><b>Shrieks</b> of laughter.</i>
<b>yell</b>	A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition. <i>A <b>yell</b> of pain.</i>



### **Usage Examples of "Exclamation" as a noun**

- *An exclamation of amazement.*
- *She gave an exclamation of delight.*



## Associations of "Exclamation" (30 Words)

<b>alphabet</b>	A set of letters or symbols in a fixed order used to represent the basic set of speech sounds of a language, especially the set of letters from A to Z. A <i>phonetic <b>alphabet</b></i> .
<b><u>amazement</u></b>	The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising. To her <i><b>amazement</b></i> Bill was keen.
<b>ampere</b>	A former unit of electric current slightly smaller than the SI ampere.
<b>ampersand</b>	A punctuation mark (&) used to represent conjunction (and).
<b>antonym</b>	A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other. To him the <i><b>antonym</b></i> of gay was depressed.
<b>apostrophe</b>	The mark (') used to indicate the omission of one or more letters from a printed word.
<b>astonishment</b>	Great surprise. He looked at me in <i><b>astonishment</b></i> .
<b><u>bewilderment</u></b>	A feeling of being perplexed and confused. The three of them looked at him in <i><b>bewilderment</b></i> .
<b>bewitchment</b>	A magical spell.
<b>comma</b>	Anglewing butterfly with a comma shaped mark on the underside of each hind wing.
<b>dot</b>	Mark with a dot. <i><b>Dot</b></i> your i s.

<b>gasp</b>	Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>It s beautiful she <b>gasp</b>ed much impressed.</i>
<b>grammar</b>	A grammar school. <i>It was not bad <b>grammar</b> just dialect.</i>
<b>grandiloquence</b>	High-flown style; excessive use of verbal ornamentation.
<b>homonym</b>	Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced and spelled the same way but have different meanings.
<b>mark</b>	Mark with a scar. <i>The blow left a red <b>mark</b> down one side of her face.</i>
<b>orthography</b>	The study of spelling and how letters combine to represent sounds and form words. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned <b>orthography</b>.</i>
<b>outcry</b>	Shout louder than. <i>The public <b>outcry</b> over the bombing.</i>
<b>punctuate</b>	Interrupt or intersperse something with. <i>The country s history has been <b>punctuated</b> by coups.</i>
<b>punctuation</b>	The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and <b>punctuation</b>.</i>
<b>quotation</b>	A price offered by a market-maker for the sale or purchase of a stock or other security. <i>Ensure you receive a written <b>quotation</b> covering all aspects of the job.</i>
<b><u>rhetoric</u></b>	Language designed to have a persuasive or impressive effect, but which is often regarded as lacking in sincerity or meaningful content. <i>Mere <b>rhetoric</b>.</i>
<b>sentence</b>	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>He was under <b>sentence</b> of death.</i>
<b><u>spelling</u></b>	Forming words with letters according to the principles underlying accepted usage. <i>The books and <b>spelling</b> in my class were too simple.</i>
<b>style</b>	In an invertebrate a small slender pointed appendage a stylet. <i>They <b>styled</b> their nation The Confederate States.</i>
<b><u>symbol</u></b>	Symbolize. <i>The Red Cross <b>symbol</b>.</i>
<b>typo</b>	A typographical error.

- typographic** Relating to or occurring or used in typography.

- word** The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus.
