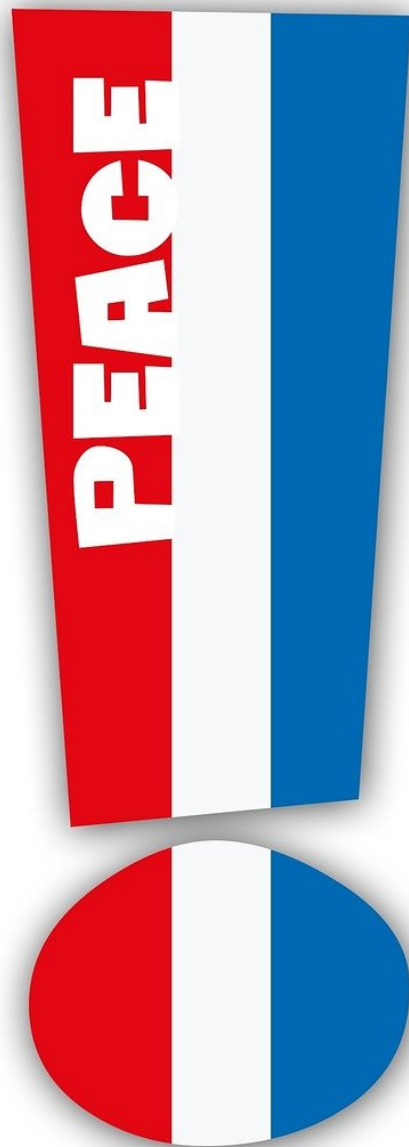
The synonyms of “Exclamation” are: ecphonesis, exclaiming, cry, call, shout, yell, shriek, roar, bellow, interjection

Definitions of "Exclamation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “exclamation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A sudden cry or remark expressing surprise, strong emotion, or pain.*
- *An exclamatory rhetorical device.*
- *An abrupt excited utterance.*
- *A loud complaint or protest or reproach.*



Synonyms of "Exclamation" as a noun (10 Words)

| bellow | A very loud utterance (like the sound of an animal). A bellow of rage. |
| call | A direction in a square dance given by the caller. <i>The alternative call of 2 would be quite unsound.</i> |
| cry | A pack of hounds. <i>I still have a cry sometimes when I realize that my mother is dead.</i> |
| ecphonesis | An exclamatory rhetorical device. |
| exclaiming | An abrupt excited utterance. <i>There was much exclaiming over it.</i> |
| interjection | The action of interjecting or interposing an action or remark that interrupts. <i>Barracking and interjections from the protesters.</i> |
| <u>roar</u> | A deep prolonged loud noise. <i>Her remarks brought a roar of laughter from the old man.</i> |
| <u>shout</u> | A call-out for one of the emergency services. <i>His words were interrupted by warning shouts.</i> |
| shriek | An exclamation mark. <i>Shriecks of laughter.</i> |
| <u>yell</u> | A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition. A yell of pain. |



Usage Examples of "Exclamation" as a noun

- *An exclamation of amazement.*
- *She gave an exclamation of delight.*



Associations of "Exclamation" (30 Words)

| alphabet | A set of letters or symbols in a fixed order used to represent the basic set of speech sounds of a language, especially the set of letters from A to Z. <i>A phonetic alphabet.</i> |
| <u>amazement</u> | The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising. <i>To her amazement Bill was keen.</i> |
| ampere | A former unit of electric current slightly smaller than the SI ampere. |
| ampersand | A punctuation mark (&) used to represent conjunction (and). |
| antonym | A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other. <i>To him the antonym of gay was depressed.</i> |
| apostrophe | The mark (') used to indicate the omission of one or more letters from a printed word. |
| astonishment | Great surprise. <i>He looked at me in astonishment.</i> |
| <u>bewilderment</u> | A feeling of being perplexed and confused. <i>The three of them looked at him in bewilderment.</i> |
| bewitchment | A magical spell. |
| comma | Anglewing butterfly with a comma shaped mark on the underside of each hind wing. |
| dot | Mark with a dot. <i>Dot your i s.</i> |

| gasp | Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>It s beautiful she gasped much impressed.</i> |
| grammar | A grammar school. <i>It was not bad grammar just dialect.</i> |
| grandiloquence | High-flown style; excessive use of verbal ornamentation. |
| homonym | Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced and spelled the same way but have different meanings. |
| mark | Mark with a scar. <i>The blow left a red mark down one side of her face.</i> |
| orthography | The study of spelling and how letters combine to represent sounds and form words. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i> |
| outcry | Shout louder than. <i>The public outcry over the bombing.</i> |
| punctuate | Interrupt or intersperse something with. <i>The country s history has been punctuated by coups.</i> |
| punctuation | The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>Satisfactory standards of handwriting spelling grammar and punctuation.</i> |
| quotation | A price offered by a market-maker for the sale or purchase of a stock or other security. <i>Ensure you receive a written quotation covering all aspects of the job.</i> |
| <u>rhetoric</u> | Language designed to have a persuasive or impressive effect, but which is often regarded as lacking in sincerity or meaningful content. <i>Mere rhetoric.</i> |
| sentence | Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>He was under sentence of death.</i> |
| <u>spelling</u> | Forming words with letters according to the principles underlying accepted usage. <i>The books and spelling in my class were too simple.</i> |
| style | In an invertebrate a small slender pointed appendage a stylet. <i>They styled their nation The Confederate States.</i> |
| <u>symbol</u> | Symbolize. <i>The Red Cross symbol.</i> |
| typo | A typographical error. |
