## **Excrete as a Verb**

### **Definitions of "Excrete" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “excrete” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Eliminate from the body.*
- *(of a living organism or cell) separate and expel as waste (a substance, especially a product of metabolism).*



## Synonyms of "Excrete" as a verb (8 Words)

- discharge** Go off or discharge.  
*The eyes and nose began to **discharge**.*
- egest** (of a cell or organism) excrete (waste matter).  
*Animals that feed near the surface will **egest** material at depth.*
- eject** Leave an aircraft rapidly using an ejection seat or capsule.  
*Angry supporters were forcibly **ejected** from the court.*  
Eliminate from the body.
- eliminate** *The acid portion of one molecule reacts with the basic portion of the other and water is **eliminated**.*
- evacuate** Move people from their homes or country.  
*When it springs a leak **evacuate** the pond.*
- expel** Force (someone) to leave a place.  
*She was **expelled** from school.*

- pass** Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life.  
*His intent was to **pass** the ball forward rather than knock it back.*
- void** Excrete or discharge from the body.  
***Void** a plea.*



## Usage Examples of "Excrete" as a verb

- *Excess bicarbonate is excreted by the kidney.*

## Associations of "Excrete" (30 Words)

- aft** At near or towards the stern of a ship or tail of an aircraft.  
*The **aft** cargo compartment.*
- bathroom** A set of matching units to be fitted in a bathroom especially as sold together.  
*I have to go to the **bathroom**.*

<b>cistern</b>	An artificial reservoir for storing liquids; especially an underground tank for storing rainwater.
<b>deck</b>	A floor or platform resembling or compared to a ship's deck. <i>Lisa threatened to <b>deck</b> her if she didn't stop filming.</i>
<b>digest</b>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. <i>A <b>digest</b> of their findings.</i>
<b>digestion</b>	The organic process by which food is converted into substances that can be absorbed into the body. <i>His appetite for facts was better than his <b>digestion</b>.</i>
<b>draining</b>	Having a debilitating effect.
<b>eliminate</b>	Eliminate from the body. <i>A policy that would <b>eliminate</b> inflation.</i>
<b>evacuation</b>	A quantity of matter discharged from the bowels or another bodily organ. <i>Those who required an <b>evacuation</b> of retained products.</i>
<b>excrement</b>	Waste matter (as urine or sweat but especially feces) discharged from the body.
<b>excretion</b>	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. <i>Bodily <b>excretions</b>.</i>
<b>faucet</b>	A regulator for controlling the flow of a liquid from a reservoir.
<b>feces</b>	Solid excretory product evacuated from the bowels.
<b>fertilizer</b>	Any substance such as manure or a mixture of nitrates used to make soil more fertile. <i>Sewage sludge could be a valuable <b>fertilizer</b> for use in British forests.</i>
<b>forecastle</b>	Living quarters consisting of a superstructure in the bow of a merchant ship where the crew is housed.
<b>gutter</b>	Provide with gutters. <i>The cooling lava continued to <b>gutter</b> toward lower ground.</i>
<b>hygiene</b>	A condition promoting sanitary practices. <i>Poor standards of food <b>hygiene</b>.</i>
<b>lavatory</b>	A toilet that is cleaned of waste by the flow of water through it. <i>He locked himself in the downstairs <b>lavatory</b>.</i>
<b>manure</b>	Spread manure as for fertilization. <i>The ground should be well dug and <b>manured</b>.</i>
<b>plumbing</b>	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. <i>The kitchen has a gas cooker point and <b>plumbing</b> for an automatic washing machine.</i>
<b>restroom</b>	A toilet in a public building.

<b>secretion</b>	A substance discharged by secretion. <i>Alcohol had a stimulatory effect on gastric acid <b>secretion</b>.</i>
<b>sewage</b>	Waste water and excrement conveyed in sewers. <i><b>Sewage</b> treatment.</i>
<b>shower</b>	Cause a mass of small things to fall in a shower. <i>His hooves <b>showered</b> sparks across the concrete floor.</i>
<b>sweat</b>	Salty fluid secreted by sweat glands. <i>I don't believe he'd get into such a <b>sweat</b> about a girl.</i>
<b>toilet</b>	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>He got up to go to the <b>toilet</b>.</i>
<b>tub</b>	Plant in a tub. <i>She ate a <b>tub</b> of yogurt.</i>
<b>urinary</b>	Of or relating to the urinary system of the body. <i>The <b>urinary</b> tract.</i>
<b>waste</b>	Run off as waste. <i><b>Waste</b> a joke on an unappreciative audience.</i>
