Definitions of "Excrete" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "excrete" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Eliminate from the body.
- (of a living organism or cell) separate and expel as waste (a substance, especially a product of metabolism.





Synonyms of "Excrete" as a verb (8 Words)

Go off or discharge. **discharge** The eyes and nose began to **discharge**. (of a cell or organism) excrete (waste matter. egest Animals that feed near the surface will **egest** material at depth. Leave an aircraft rapidly using an ejection seat or capsule. eject Angry supporters were forcibly **eject**ed from the court. Eliminate from the body. eliminate The acid portion of one molecule reacts with the basic portion of the other and water is **eliminate**d. Move people from their homes or country. evacuate When it springs a leak **evacuate** the pond. Force (someone) to leave a place. <u>expel</u> She was *expel*led from school.



pass	Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. His intent was to pass the ball forward rather than knock it back.
<u>void</u>	Excrete or discharge from the body. Void a plea.



Usage Examples of "Excrete" as a verb

• Excess bicarbonate is excreted by the kidney.

Associations of "Excrete" (30 Words)

aft	At near or towards the stern of a ship or tail of an aircraft. The aft cargo compartment.
bathroom	A set of matching units to be fitted in a bathroom especially as sold together. <i>I have to go to the bathroom</i> .



cistern	An artificial reservoir for storing liquids; especially an underground tank for storing rainwater.
deck	A floor or platform resembling or compared to a ship s deck. Lisa threatened to deck her if she didn t stop filming.
<u>digest</u>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. A digest of their findings.
digestion	The organic process by which food is converted into substances that can be absorbed into the body. His appetite for facts was better than his digestion .
draining	Having a debilitating effect.
eliminate	Eliminate from the body. A policy that would eliminate inflation.
evacuation	A quantity of matter discharged from the bowels or another bodily organ. Those who required an evacuation of retained products.
excrement	Waste matter (as urine or sweat but especially feces) discharged from the body.
excretion	The bodily process of discharging waste matter. Bodily excretion s.
faucet	A regulator for controlling the flow of a liquid from a reservoir.
<u>feces</u>	Solid excretory product evacuated from the bowels.
fertilizer	Any substance such as manure or a mixture of nitrates used to make soil more fertile. Sewage sludge could be a valuable fertilizer for use in British forests.
forecastle	Living quarters consisting of a superstructure in the bow of a merchant ship where the crew is housed.
gutter	Provide with gutters. The cooling lava continued to gutter toward lower ground.
<u>hygiene</u>	A condition promoting sanitary practices. Poor standards of food hygiene .
lavatory	A toilet that is cleaned of waste by the flow of water through it. <i>He locked himself in the downstairs lavatory.</i>
manure	Spread manure as for fertilization. The ground should be well dug and manure d.
plumbing	The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system. The kitchen has a gas cooker point and plumbing for an automatic washing machine.
restroom	A toilet in a public building.



secretion	A substance discharged by secretion. Alcohol had a stimulatory effect on gastric acid secretion .
sewage	Waste water and excrement conveyed in sewers. <i>Sewage</i> treatment.
shower	Cause a mass of small things to fall in a shower. His hooves shower ed sparks across the concrete floor.
sweat	Salty fluid secreted by sweat glands. I don t believe he d get into such a sweat about a girl.
toilet	A room or building equipped with one or more toilets. <i>He got up to go to the toilet.</i>
tub	Plant in a tub. She ate a tub of yogurt.
urinary	Of or relating to the urinary system of the body. <i>The urinary tract.</i>
waste	Run off as waste. Waste a joke on an unappreciative audience.
