- Eliminate from the body.
- (of a living organism or cell) separate and expel as waste (a substance, especially a product of metabolism.

Animals that feed near the surface will **egest** material at depth.

Leave an aircraft rapidly using an ejection seat or capsule. eject Angry supporters were forcibly **eject**ed from the court.

Eliminate from the body.

eliminate The acid portion of one molecule reacts with the basic portion of the other and

water is **eliminate**d.

Move people from their homes or country. evacuate When it springs a leak **evacuate** the pond.

Force (someone) to leave a place. <u>expel</u>

She was **expel**led from school.



Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to

excrement Waste matter (as urine or sweat but especially feces) discharged from the

body.

The bodily process of discharging waste matter.

excretion Bodily excretions.

faucet A regulator for controlling the flow of a liquid from a reservoir.

feces Solid excretory product evacuated from the bowels.

Any substance such as manure or a mixture of nitrates used to make soil more

fertilizer fertile.

Sewage sludge could be a valuable **fertilizer** for use in British forests.

forecastle Living quarters consisting of a superstructure in the bow of a merchant ship

where the crew is housed.

gutter Provide with gutters.

The cooling lava continued to **gutter** toward lower ground.

hygiene A condition promoting sanitary practices.

Poor standards of food **hygiene**.

lavatory A toilet that is cleaned of waste by the flow of water through it.

He locked himself in the downstairs **lavatory**.

manure Spread manure as for fertilization.

The ground should be well dug and **manure**d.

The work of installing and maintaining a plumbing system.

plumbing The kitchen has a gas cooker point and **plumbing** for an automatic washing

machine.

restroom A toilet in a public building.



secretion A substance discharged by secretion.

Alcohol had a stimulatory effect on gastric acid **secretion**.

sewage Waste water and excrement conveyed in sewers.

Sewage treatment.

shower Cause a mass of small things to fall in a shower.

His hooves **shower**ed sparks across the concrete floor.

sweat Salty fluid secreted by sweat glands.

I don t believe he d get into such a **sweat** about a girl.

toilet A room or building equipped with one or more toilets.

He got up to go to the **toilet**.

tub Plant in a tub.

She ate a **tub** of yogurt.

urinary Of or relating to the urinary system of the body.

The **urinary** tract.

Run off as waste.

waste Waste a joke on an unappreciative audience.
