Synonyms of "Excruciating" as an adjective (19 Words)

<u>acute</u>	Denoting or designed for patients with an acute form of a disease. An acute awareness of changing fashions.
agonising	Extremely painful.
agonizing	Causing great physical or mental pain. There is an agonizing choice to make.
extreme	Very severe or serious. Expulsion is an extreme sanction.
grievous	Shockingly brutal or cruel. <i>Grievous</i> bodily harm.



harrowing	Extremely painful. A harrowing film about racism and violence.
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense</i> anxiety.
piercing	Painful as if caused by a sharp instrument. <i>Piercing</i> knifelike pains.
racking	Causing great physical or mental suffering.
<u>raging</u>	Characterized by violent and forceful activity or movement; very intense. A <i>raging</i> thirst.
savage	Without civilizing influences. A savage people.
searing	Having lost all moisture. A searing pain.
<u>severe</u>	Severely simple. A severe worldwide depression.
stabbing	(of a pain or sensation) sharp and sudden. A stabbing remark.
tormenting	Inflicting severe physical or mental suffering. <i>Peace from his tormenting thoughts.</i>
torturesome	Extremely painful.
torturing	Extremely painful.
<u>torturous</u>	Characterized by, involving, or causing pain or suffering. A torturous five days of fitness training.
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A violent</i> attack.

Usage Examples of "Excruciating" as an adjective

- Excruciating back pain.
- *He explained the procedure in excruciating detail.*

Associations of "Excruciating" (30 Words)

aching A dull persistent (usually moderately intense) pain. *The cool air was a relief to my aching head.*



agonizing	Causing great physical or mental pain. There is an agonizing choice to make.
biting	(of wind or cold) so cold as to be painful. A cream to ward off biting insects.
<u>bitter</u>	Beer that is strongly flavoured with hops and has a bitter taste brewed by top fermentation. Shed bitter tears.
callus	Form a callus or calluses. The long march had callus ed his feet.
cultivator	A farm implement used to break up the surface of the soil (for aeration and weed control and conservation of moisture. Rotary cultivators are ideal in the kitchen garden.
<u>disastrous</u>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. The battle was a disastrous end to a disastrous campaign.
distressing	Causing anxiety, sorrow or pain; upsetting. <i>Distressing</i> or disturbing news.
doleful	Filled with or evoking sadness. A doleful look.
dolorous	Feeling or expressing great sorrow or distress. A dolorous and repetitive tale of atrocity.
<u>frustrating</u>	Causing annoyance or upset because of an inability to change or achieve something. It can be very frustrating to find that the size you want isn t there.
grievous	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. A grievous loss.
harrowing	Extremely painful. It was a harrowing experience.
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. A horrible massacre.
irksome	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. What an irksome task the writing of long letters is.
lamentable	Bad; unfortunate. Her open prejudice showed lamentable immaturity.
mournful	Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. <i>Mournful news</i> .
<u>painful</u>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. The painful process of growing up.



<u>plaintive</u>	Expressing sorrow. A plaintive cry.
<u>poignant</u>	Arousing affect. Poignant anxiety.
sad	Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti. The show is tongue in cheek anyone who takes it seriously is a bit sad .
sore	Roused to anger- Mark Twain. All of us had sore s and infections on our hands.
<u>sorrowful</u>	Feeling or showing grief. <i>Sorrowful widows.</i>
<u>stressful</u>	Extremely irritating to the nerves. The stressful days before a war.
<u>swollen</u>	Characteristic of false pride; having an exaggerated sense of self-importance. So swollen by victory that he was unfit for normal duty.
tine	Prong on a fork or pitchfork or antler.
<u>torturous</u>	Characterized by, involving, or causing pain or suffering. A torturous five days of fitness training.
<u>tragic</u>	Very bad or inadequate. A tragic face.
<u>traumatic</u>	Of or relating to a physical injury or wound to the body. She was going through a traumatic divorce.
trying	Difficult or annoying; hard to endure. A trying day at the office.
