raging Characterized by violent and forceful activity or movement; very intense.

A **raging** thirst.

Without civilizing influences.

savage A savage people.

searing Having lost all moisture.

A **searing** pain.

Severely simple.

A **severe** worldwide depression.

stabbing (of a pain or sensation) sharp and sudden.

A **stabbing** remark.

tormenting Inflicting severe physical or mental suffering.

Peace from his tormenting thoughts.

torturing Extremely painful.

torturous Characterized by, involving, or causing pain or suffering.

A **torturous** five days of fitness training.

Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react

violent violently fervid.
