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## Associations of "Executed" (30 Words)

<b>airway</b>	A duct that provides ventilation (as in mines. <i>He kept the man s <b>airway</b> clear and blood circulating.</i>
<b>apprehend</b>	Arrest (someone) for a crime. <i>He is a man that <b>apprehends</b> death no more dreadfully but as a drunken sleep.</i>
<b>arrest</b>	Attract and fix. <i>They placed her under <b>arrest</b>.</i>
<b>capture</b>	Capture as if by hunting snaring or trapping. <i>The island was <b>captured</b> by Australian forces in 1914.</i>
<b>choke</b>	Cause a person or animal to choke. <i>Many guns may not have the right <b>choke</b>.</i>
<b>clutter</b>	An untidy state. <i>The attic is full of <b>clutter</b>.</i>
<b>convict</b>	A person who has been convicted of a criminal offense. <i>The man was <b>convicted</b> of fraud and sentenced.</i>
<b>criminal</b>	Relating to crime as opposed to civil matters. <i><b>Criminal</b> in the sight of God and man.</i>
<b>death</b>	The personification of death. <i>He seemed more content in <b>death</b> than he had ever been in life.</i>
<b>drown</b>	Deliberately kill a person or animal by drowning. <i>The noise <b>drowned</b> out her speech.</i>
<b>garrote</b>	Strangle with an iron collar.
<b>hanging</b>	The act of suspending something hanging it from above so it moves freely. <i>There was a small ceremony for the <b>hanging</b> of the portrait.</i>
<b>imprison</b>	Put or keep in prison or a place like a prison. <i>The suspects were <b>imprisoned</b> without trial.</i>

<b>ligature</b>	Bind or connect with a ligature. <i>He <b>ligatured</b> the duodenum below the pylorus.</i>
<b>muffle</b>	Cover or wrap up (a source of sound) to reduce its loudness. <i>The trade unions fear their voice within the party is being <b>muffled</b>.</i>
<b>obstruct</b>	(in various sports) impede (a player in the opposing team) in a manner which constitutes an offence. <i>The appellants were arrested and later convicted of <b>obstructing</b> the police.</i>
<b>oppress</b>	Come down on or keep down by unjust use of one's authority. <i>The government <b>oppresses</b> political activists.</i>
<b>prison</b>	A prisonlike situation a place of seeming confinement. <i>The young man was <b>prisoned</b> behind the doors.</i>
<b>prisoner</b>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>A <b>prisoner</b> serving a life sentence.</i>
<b>smother</b>	Kill (someone) by covering their nose and mouth so that they suffocate. <i>I dreamt a stranger was trying to kill me by <b>smothering</b> me with a pillow.</i>
<b>stifle</b>	Restrain (a reaction) or stop oneself acting on (an emotion). <i>She <b>stifled</b> a giggle.</i>
<b>strangle</b>	Die from strangulation. <i>The victim was <b>strangled</b> with a scarf.</i>
<b>suffocate</b>	Struggle for breath; have insufficient oxygen intake. <i>The child <b>suffocated</b> under the pillow.</i>
<b>suffocation</b>	Difficulty in breathing. <i>The country's slow <b>suffocation</b> under the ever increasing weight of red tape.</i>
<b>throttle</b>	Control an engine or vehicle with a throttle. <i>The pitch of the engine fell as the driver <b>throttled</b> back.</i>
<b>torture</b>	Subject to torture. <i>Confessions extracted under <b>torture</b>.</i>
<b>trial</b>	Of a horse dog or other animal compete in trials. <i>A <b>trial</b> of progesterone failed to relieve the pain.</i>
<b>valve</b>	Each of the halves of the hinged shell of a bivalve mollusc or brachiopod or of the parts of the compound shell of a barnacle. <i>The aortic <b>valve</b>.</i>
