embodiment	The representation or expression of something in a tangible or visible form. <i>She seemed to be a living embodiment of vitality.</i>
epitome	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
essence	Any substance possessing to a high degree the predominant properties of a plant or drug or other natural product from which it is extracted. <i>Locke's scepticism about our ability to penetrate to the real essences of things.</i>
example	A person or thing regarded in terms of their fitness to be imitated. <i>This patient provides a typical example of the syndrome.</i>

exemplification	A representational or typifying form or model.
good example	Benefit.
ideal	A person or thing regarded as perfect. <i>You re my ideal of how a man should be.</i>
model	A person or thing regarded as an excellent example of a specified quality. <i>Wax models were used by sculptors in the lost wax method of bronze casting.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	A person or thing viewed as a model of excellence. <i>It would have taken a paragon of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.</i>
perfect example	A tense of verbs used in describing action that has been completed (sometimes regarded as perfective aspect).
quintessence	The purest and most concentrated essence of something. <i>He was the quintessence of political professionalism.</i>
shining example	The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it.
textbook example	A book prepared for use in schools or colleges.
type	Metal types used in letterpress printing. <i>The dolphin is a conventional type of Christ.</i>

<u>archetype</u>	A recurrent symbol or motif in literature, art, or mythology. <i>He was the archetype of the old style football club chairman.</i>
best	Having the most positive qualities. <i>He brought out the best in people.</i>
<u>chivalry</u>	Courtesy towards women. <i>He still retained a sense of chivalry towards women.</i>
emulation	Effort to match or surpass a person or achievement, typically by imitation. <i>Software emulation of complete systems.</i>
<u>epitome</u>	A thing representing something else in miniature. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>

example	Be illustrated or exemplified. <i>A workbook and a data set will enable the researcher to follow worked examples.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	Serving to warn. <i>Exemplary behavior.</i>
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
ideal	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. <i>In an ideal world we might have made a different decision.</i>
<u>instance</u>	An item of information that is typical of a class or group. <i>I instanced Bob as someone whose commitment had certainly got things done.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>Honeysuckle was growing up a lattice round the door.</i>
lesson	A period of learning or teaching. <i>Let that be a lesson to you.</i>
mannequin	A dummy used to display clothes in a shop window. <i>She was too fat to be a mannequin.</i>
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. <i>A model of St Paul s Cathedral.</i>
monitory	Serving to warn. <i>Shook a monitory finger at him.</i>
moral	Standards of behaviour; principles of right and wrong. <i>A moral life.</i>
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>Original Rembrandts.</i>
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>The discovery of universal gravitation became the paradigm of successful science.</i>
paradigmatic	Of or relating to a typical example. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal. <i>Your cook is a paragon.</i>
<u>photogenic</u>	(of an organism or tissue) producing or emitting light. <i>A photogenic child.</i>

prototype	Make a prototype of a product. <i>The construction of bandpass networks from low pass prototypes.</i>
quintessence	(in classical and medieval philosophy) a fifth substance in addition to the four elements, thought to compose the heavenly bodies and to be latent in all things. <i>We were all brought up to believe that advertising is the quintessence of marketing.</i>
sample	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. <i>Sample some entertaining nights out in Liverpool.</i>
specimen	An example of something regarded as typical of its class or group. <i>Specimens of copper ore.</i>
spheroid	A solid generated by a half revolution of an ellipse about its major axis prolate spheroid or minor axis oblate spheroid. <i>It looked like a sphere but on closer examination I saw it was really a spheroid.</i>
standard	Conforming to or constituting a standard of measurement or value or of the usual or regularized or accepted kind. <i>The system had become an industry standard.</i>
typify	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation typifies this arctic area.</i>
universality	The quality of involving or being shared by all people or things in the world or in a particular group. <i>The principle of universality was abandoned in favour of means tested payments.</i>
virtue	Morality with respect to sexual relations. <i>There s no virtue in suffering in silence.</i>
