paradigmatic	<p>Of or relating to a grammatical paradigm.</p> <p><i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i></p>
plenipotentiary	<p>A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government.</p> <p><i>A minister plenipotentiary.</i></p>
praiseworthy	<p>Deserving approval and admiration.</p> <p><i>The government's praiseworthy efforts.</i></p>
