<b><u>paradigm</u></b>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>The discovery of universal gravitation became the <b>paradigm</b> of successful science.</i>
<b>paradigmatic</b>	Of or relating to a grammatical paradigm. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>A minister <b>plenipotentiary</b>.</i>
<b>praiseworthy</b>	Deserving approval and admiration. <i>The government's <b>praiseworthy</b> efforts.</i>
<b>prototype</b>	Make a prototype of a product. <i>He is the <b>prototype</b> of good breeding.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Of a government or political system based on elected or chosen representatives. <i>There was no <b>representative</b> body to fight for cricketers until 1968.</i>
<b>spokesperson</b>	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>A <b>spokesperson</b> for the Scottish Office.</i>
<b>superior</b>	A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a higher position. <i>A <b>superior</b> ruler.</i>
<b><u>surpass</u></b>	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>Her performance <b>surpasses</b> that of any other student I know.</i>
<b>transcendent</b>	Beyond and outside the ordinary range of human experience or understanding. <i>The search for a <b>transcendent</b> level of knowledge.</i>
