**illustrate** Explain or make (something) clear by using examples, charts, pictures, etc.

**instance** Clarify by giving an example of.  
*I **instanced** Bob as someone whose commitment had certainly got things done.*

**represent** Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute.  
*She became the first woman to **represent** a South Wales mining valley.*

<b>archetypal</b>	Representing or constituting an original type after which other similar things are patterned. <i>Archetypal patterns.</i>
<b>best</b>	(comparative and superlative of `well') wiser or more advantageous and hence advisable. <i>Father knows <b>best</b>.</i>
<b><u>contingent</u></b>	A temporary military unit. <i>Arms sales <b>contingent</b> on the approval of congress.</i>
<b><u>emblem</u></b>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. <i>America's national <b>emblem</b> the bald eagle.</i>

<b><u>exemplar</u></b>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. <i>An <b>exemplar</b> of success.</i>
<b><u>exemplary</u></b>	Characteristic of its kind or illustrating a general rule. <i>An <b>exemplary</b> jail sentence.</i>
<b>illustration</b>	An illustrative example. <i>By way of <b>illustration</b> I refer to the following case.</i>
<b><u>implicit</u></b>	(of a function) not expressed directly in terms of independent variables. <i><b>Implicit</b> trust.</i>
<b><u>imply</u></b>	Express or state indirectly. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>incarnate</b>	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. <i>A desire to make things which will <b>incarnate</b> their personality.</i>
<b><u>instance</u></b>	An occurrence of something. <i>The search finds every <b>instance</b> where the word appears.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Put a check mark on or near or next to. <i>This sign <b>marks</b> the border.</i>
<b>model</b>	Plan or create according to a model or models. <i>The computer program was based on a <b>model</b> of the circulatory and respiratory systems.</i>

<b><u>paradigm</u></b>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>The discovery of universal gravitation became the <b>paradigm</b> of successful science.</i>
<b>paradigmatic</b>	Serving as a typical example of something. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<b><u>paragon</u></b>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>Your cook is a <b>paragon</b>.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>Our parents <b>represented</b> to us the need for more caution.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>The bust involves a high degree of <b>representative</b> abstraction.</i>
<b><u>symbol</u></b>	Symbolize. <i>The limousine was another <b>symbol</b> of his wealth and authority.</i>
<b><u>symbolic</u></b>	Serving as a visible symbol for something abstract. <i>Klimt's <b>symbolic</b> painting of 1900 7.</i>
<b>symbolism</b>	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning. <i>The old fashioned <b>symbolism</b> of flowers.</i>
<b>symbolize</b>	Be a symbol of. <i>The poet <b>symbolizes</b> love in this poem.</i>
<b>technicolor</b>	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
<b>typify</b>	Represent; symbolize. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
<b>virtue</b>	Virginity or chastity, especially of a woman. <i>There's no <b>virtue</b> in suffering in silence.</i>
<b>zodiac</b>	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
