represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. She became the first woman to <b>represent</b> a South Wales mining valley.

archetypal	Representing or constituting an original type after which other similar things are patterned. <i>Archetypal patterns.</i>
best	(comparative and superlative of `well') wiser or more advantageous and hence advisable. <i>Father knows <b>best</b></i> .
<u>contingent</u>	A temporary military unit. Arms sales <b>contingent</b> on the approval of congress.
<u>emblem</u>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. America s national <b>emblem</b> the bald eagle.
embodiment	A new personification of a familiar idea. <i>The <b>embodiment</b> of hope.</i>
<u>embody</u>	Represent in bodily form. Nothing of the personality of the Spirit as embodied in Jesus will be lost.
<u>epitome</u>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.
excellence	An outstanding feature; something in which something or someone excels. <i>A center of manufacturing excellence</i> .
<u>exemplar</u>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. An <b>exemplar</b> of success.
<u>exemplary</u>	Characteristic of its kind or illustrating a general rule. An <b>exemplary</b> jail sentence.
illustration	An illustrative example. By way of <b>illustration</b> I refer to the following case.
<u>implicit</u>	(of a function) not expressed directly in terms of independent variables. <i>Implicit</i> trust.
<u>imply</u>	Express or state indirectly. Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.
incarnate	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. A desire to make things which will <b>incarnate</b> their personality.
<u>instance</u>	An occurrence of something. The search finds every <b>instance</b> where the word appears.
mark	Put a check mark on or near or next to. <i>This sign <b>mark</b>s the border.</i>
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. The computer program was based on a <b>model</b> of the circulatory and respiratory systems.



<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>The discovery of universal gravitation became the <b>paradigm</b> of successful science.</i>
paradigmatic	Serving as a typical example of something. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>Your cook is a <b>paragon</b>.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. Our parents <b>represent</b> ed to us the need for more caution.
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. The bust involves a high degree of <b>representative</b> abstraction.
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. The limousine was another <b>symbol</b> of his wealth and authority.
<u>symbolic</u>	Serving as a visible symbol for something abstract. Klimt s <b>symbolic</b> painting of 1900 7.
symbolism	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning. The old fashioned <b>symbolism</b> of flowers.
symbolize	Be a symbol of. The poet <b>symbolize</b> s love in this poem.
technicolor	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
typify	Represent; symbolize. The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.
virtue	Virginity or chastity, especially of a woman. There s no <b>virtue</b> in suffering in silence.
zodiac	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
