illustrate Explain or make (something) clear by using examples, charts, pictures, etc.
*The World Cup **illustrated** what high standards our players must achieve.*

instance Clarify by giving an example of.
*I **instanced** Bob as someone whose commitment had certainly got things done.*

represent Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody s interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute.
*She became the first woman to **represent** a South Wales mining valley.*

Associations of "Exemplifies" (30 Words)

archetypal	Representing or constituting an original type after which other similar things are patterned. <i>Archetypal patterns.</i>
best	(comparative and superlative of `well') wiser or more advantageous and hence advisable. <i>Father knows best.</i>
<u>contingent</u>	A temporary military unit. <i>Arms sales contingent on the approval of congress.</i>
<u>emblem</u>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. <i>America's national emblem the bald eagle.</i>
embodiment	A new personification of a familiar idea. <i>The embodiment of hope.</i>
<u>embody</u>	Represent in bodily form. <i>Nothing of the personality of the Spirit as embodied in Jesus will be lost.</i>
<u>epitome</u>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
excellence	An outstanding feature; something in which something or someone excels. <i>A center of manufacturing excellence.</i>
<u>exemplar</u>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. <i>An exemplar of success.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	Characteristic of its kind or illustrating a general rule. <i>An exemplary jail sentence.</i>
illustration	An illustrative example. <i>By way of illustration I refer to the following case.</i>
<u>implicit</u>	(of a function) not expressed directly in terms of independent variables. <i>Implicit trust.</i>
<u>imply</u>	Express or state indirectly. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
incarnate	Possessing or existing in bodily form- Shakespeare. <i>A desire to make things which will incarnate their personality.</i>
<u>instance</u>	An occurrence of something. <i>The search finds every instance where the word appears.</i>
mark	Put a check mark on or near or next to. <i>This sign marks the border.</i>
model	Plan or create according to a model or models. <i>The computer program was based on a model of the circulatory and respiratory systems.</i>

<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>The discovery of universal gravitation became the paradigm of successful science.</i>
paradigmatic	Serving as a typical example of something. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. <i>Your cook is a paragon.</i>
represent	Be a delegate or spokesperson for represent somebody's interest or be a proxy or substitute for as of politicians and office holders representing their constituents or of a tenant representing other tenants in a housing dispute. <i>Our parents represented to us the need for more caution.</i>
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>The bust involves a high degree of representative abstraction.</i>
<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The limousine was another symbol of his wealth and authority.</i>
<u>symbolic</u>	Serving as a visible symbol for something abstract. <i>Klimt's symbolic painting of 1900 7.</i>
symbolism	The practice of investing things with symbolic meaning. <i>The old fashioned symbolism of flowers.</i>
symbolize	Be a symbol of. <i>The poet symbolizes love in this poem.</i>
technicolor	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
typify	Represent; symbolize. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
virtue	Virginity or chastity, especially of a woman. <i>There's no virtue in suffering in silence.</i>
zodiac	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
