be a typical example of	Spend or use time.
be representative of	Represent, as of a character on stage.
demonstrate	Establish the validity of something, as by an example, explanation or experiment. <i>She demonstrated how to cook chops.</i>
epitomize	Be a perfect example of. <i>The company epitomized the problems faced by British industry.</i>

give an example of	Place into the hands or custody of.
give an instance of	Contribute to some cause.
<u>illustrate</u>	Explain or make (something) clear by using examples, charts, pictures, etc. Illustrate a book with drawings.
<u>instance</u>	Clarify by giving an example of. <i>I instanced Bob as someone whose commitment had certainly got things done.</i>
represent	Be representative or typical for. <i>This sum represents my entire income for a year.</i>
serve as a typical example of	Do military service.
symbolize	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>A tendency to symbolize the father as the sun.</i>
typify	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation typifies this arctic area.</i>

Associations of "Exemplify" (30 Words)

archetypal	Relating to or denoting Jungian archetypes. <i>An archetypal journey representing the quest for identity.</i>
best	To the highest degree; most (used with verbs suggesting a desirable action or state or a successful outcome). <i>Father knows best.</i>
<u>contingent</u>	(of losses, liabilities, etc.) that can be anticipated to arise if a particular event occurs. <i>His fees were contingent on the success of his search.</i>
<u>emblem</u>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. <i>America's national emblem the bald eagle.</i>
embodiment	A new personification of a familiar idea. <i>A circle was the embodiment of his concept of life.</i>

<u>embody</u>	Represent or express something abstract in tangible form. <i>A national team that embodies competitive spirit and skill.</i>
<u>epitome</u>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the epitome of elegance and good taste.</i>
excellence	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>A center of manufacturing excellence.</i>
<u>exemplar</u>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. <i>An exemplar of success.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	Serving to warn. <i>Exemplary sentencing may discourage the violent minority.</i>
illustration	A visual representation (a picture or diagram) that is used make some subject more pleasing or easier to understand. <i>An illustration of a yacht.</i>
<u>implicit</u>	With no qualification or question; absolute. <i>Comments seen as implicit criticism of the policies.</i>
<u>imply</u>	Suggest that someone is guilty. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i>
incarnate	Invested with a bodily form especially of a human body. <i>Here is capitalism incarnate.</i>
<u>instance</u>	Clarify by giving an example of. <i>A serious instance of corruption.</i>
mark	Make small marks into the surface of. <i>An envelope marked private and confidential.</i>
model	Work as a model by displaying clothes or posing for an artist or sculptor. <i>A model of St Paul s Cathedral.</i>
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society s paradigm of the ideal woman.</i>
paradigmatic	Related as members of a substitution class. <i>His biography is paradigmatic of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal. <i>Your cook is a paragon.</i>
represent	Be representative or typical for. <i>This period is represented by Beethoven.</i>
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>A PLO representative attending a meeting in Damascus.</i>

<u>symbol</u>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical symbol for helium is He.</i>
<u>symbolic</u>	Using symbolism. <i>The release of the dissident was an important symbolic gesture.</i>
symbolism	Symbolic meaning attributed to natural objects or facts. <i>The old fashioned symbolism of flowers.</i>
symbolize	Be a symbol of. <i>These painters believed that artists should symbolize.</i>
technicolor	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
typify	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
virtue	(in traditional Christian angelology) the seventh-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy. <i>There s no virtue in suffering in silence.</i>
zodiac	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
