<b>be representative of</b>	Represent, as of a character on stage.
<b>demonstrate</b>	Establish the validity of something, as by an example, explanation or experiment. <i>She <b>demonstrated</b> how to cook chops.</i>
<b><a href="#">epitomize</a></b>	Be a perfect example of. <i>The company <b>epitomized</b> the problems faced by British industry.</i>

<b>give an example of</b>	Place into the hands or custody of.
<b>give an instance of</b>	Contribute to some cause.
<b><u>illustrate</u></b>	Explain or make (something) clear by using examples, charts, pictures, etc. <b>Illustrate</b> a book with drawings.
<b><u>instance</u></b>	Clarify by giving an example of. <i>I <b>instanced</b> Bob as someone whose commitment had certainly got things done.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be representative or typical for. <i>This sum <b>represents</b> my entire income for a year.</i>
<b>serve as a typical example of</b>	Do military service.
<b>symbolize</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>A tendency to <b>symbolize</b> the father as the sun.</i>
<b>typify</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>Tough, low-lying vegetation typifies this arctic area.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Exemplify" as a verb

- *He exemplified his point with an anecdote.*

## Associations of "Exemplify" (30 Words)

<b>archetypal</b>	Relating to or denoting Jungian archetypes. <i>An <b>archetypal</b> journey representing the quest for identity.</i>
<b>best</b>	To the highest degree; most (used with verbs suggesting a desirable action or state or a successful outcome). <i>Father knows <b>best</b>.</i>
<b><u>contingent</u></b>	(of losses, liabilities, etc.) that can be anticipated to arise if a particular event occurs. <i>His fees were <b>contingent</b> on the success of his search.</i>
<b><u>emblem</u></b>	A visible symbol representing an abstract idea. <i>America's national <b>emblem</b> the bald eagle.</i>
<b>embodiment</b>	A new personification of a familiar idea. <i>A circle was the <b>embodiment</b> of his concept of life.</i>

<b>embody</b>	Represent or express something abstract in tangible form. <i>A national team that embodies competitive spirit and skill.</i>
<b>epitome</b>	A summary of a written work; an abstract. <i>She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.</i>
<b>excellence</b>	An outstanding feature or quality. <i>A center of manufacturing <b>excellence</b>.</i>
<b>exemplar</b>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. <i>An <b>exemplar</b> of success.</i>
<b>exemplary</b>	Serving to warn. <i><b>Exemplary</b> sentencing may discourage the violent minority.</i>
<b>illustration</b>	A visual representation (a picture or diagram) that is used make some subject more pleasing or easier to understand. <i>An <b>illustration</b> of a yacht.</i>
<b>implicit</b>	With no qualification or question; absolute. <i>Comments seen as <b>implicit</b> criticism of the policies.</i>
<b>imply</b>	Suggest that someone is guilty. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to <b>imply</b> superior knowledge.</i>
<b>incarnate</b>	Invested with a bodily form especially of a human body. <i>Here is capitalism <b>incarnate</b>.</i>
<b>instance</b>	Clarify by giving an example of. <i>A serious <b>instance</b> of corruption.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Make small marks into the surface of. <i>An envelope <b>marked</b> private and confidential.</i>
<b>model</b>	Work as a model by displaying clothes or posing for an artist or sculptor. <i>A <b>model</b> of St Paul s Cathedral.</i>
<b>paradigm</b>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. <i>Society s <b>paradigm</b> of the ideal woman.</i>
<b>paradigmatic</b>	Related as members of a substitution class. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
<b>paragon</b>	Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal. <i>Your cook is a <b>paragon</b>.</i>
<b>represent</b>	Be representative or typical for. <i>This period is <b>represented</b> by Beethoven.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>A PLO <b>representative</b> attending a meeting in Damascus.</i>

<b><u>symbol</u></b>	Symbolize. <i>The chemical <b>symbol</b> for helium is He.</i>
<b><u>symbolic</u></b>	Using symbolism. <i>The release of the dissident was an important <b>symbolic</b> gesture.</i>
<b>symbolism</b>	Symbolic meaning attributed to natural objects or facts. <i>The old fashioned <b>symbolism</b> of flowers.</i>
<b>symbolize</b>	Be a symbol of. <i>These painters believed that artists should <b>symbolize</b>.</i>
<b>technicolor</b>	A trademarked method of making color motion pictures.
<b>typify</b>	Express indirectly by an image, form, or model; be a symbol. <i>The sun typified the Greeks, and the moon the Persians.</i>
<b>virtue</b>	(in traditional Christian angelology) the seventh-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy. <i>There s no <b>virtue</b> in suffering in silence.</i>
<b>zodiac</b>	Astrology a circular diagram representing the 12 zodiacal constellations and showing their signs.
