belabor	To work at or to absurd length. <i>She was belabored by her fellow students.</i>
catalyze	Change by catalysis or cause to catalyze.
clout	A long distance shot that hits a clout. <i>I clouted him round the head.</i>
extrude	Thrust or force out. <i>Lava was being extruded from the volcano.</i>
gavel	Bring a hearing or person to order by use of a gavel. <i>He gavelled the convention to order.</i>
hit	Hit with a missile from a weapon. <i>It was still night when we hit the outskirts of London.</i>
impact	The violent interaction of individuals or groups entering into combat. <i>The book had an important impact on my thinking.</i>
impinge	Impinge or infringe upon. <i>Several factors impinge on market efficiency.</i>
implication	Something that is inferred (deduced or entailed or implied). <i>He was suspected of implication in several robberies.</i>
impression	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>Her courtesy had made a good impression.</i>
influence	Have an influence on. <i>The influence of television violence.</i>
jostle	The action of jostling. <i>People jostled against us.</i>
leverage	Mechanical advantage gained by leverage. <i>We need to leverage this company.</i>
maintain	Maintain by writing regular records. <i>The need to maintain close links between industry and schools.</i>

manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. <i>The skills needed to manage a young dynamic team.</i>
militate	Have force or influence; bring about an effect or change. <i>These fundamental differences will militate against the two communities coming together.</i>
moderating	Lessening in intensity or strength.
pierce	14th President of the United States (1804-1869). <i>I pierced my nose and ears.</i>
predispose	Make someone liable or inclined to a specified attitude, action, or condition. <i>This illness predisposes you to gain weight.</i>
press	Press from a plastic. <i>The incident was not reported in the press.</i>
pressure	The act of pressing the exertion of pressure. <i>The compressed gas exerts an increased pressure.</i>
punch	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>I punched the button to summon the lift.</i>
push	Make strenuous pushing movements during birth to expel the baby. <i>The Dean is pushing for his favorite candidate.</i>
pushing	The act of applying force in order to move something away. <i>The pushing is good exercise.</i>
shove	The act of shoving (giving a push to someone or something). <i>I should have told the boss to shove it.</i>
suggestible	Open to suggestion; easily swayed. <i>A suggestible client would comply.</i>
systemic	(of an insecticide, fungicide, or similar substance) entering the plant via the roots or shoots and passing through the tissues. <i>The disease is localized rather than systemic.</i>
wangle	An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation. <i>A rather clever wangle on the part of some of the folk at the office.</i>
wield	Have and exercise. <i>A masked raider wielding a handgun.</i>
