<u>catalyze</u>	Change by catalysis or cause to catalyze.
<u>clout</u>	A long distance shot that hits a clout. I <b>clout</b> ed him round the head.
extrude	Thrust or force out. Lava was being <b>extrude</b> d from the volcano.
gavel	Bring a hearing or person to order by use of a gavel. He <b>gavel</b> led the convention to order.
hit	Hit with a missile from a weapon. It was still night when we <b>hit</b> the outskirts of London.
impact	The violent interaction of individuals or groups entering into combat. <i>The book had an important</i> <b>impact</b> <i>on my thinking.</i>
impinge	Impinge or infringe upon. Several factors <b>impinge</b> on market efficiency.
implication	Something that is inferred (deduced or entailed or implied. <i>He was suspected of implication in several robberies.</i>
impression	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. Her courtesy had made a good <b>impression</b> .
influence	Have an influence on. The <b>influence</b> of television violence.
jostle	The action of jostling. People <b>jostle</b> d against us.
leverage	Mechanical advantage gained by leverage. We need to <b>leverage</b> this company.
maintain	Maintain by writing regular records. The need to <b>maintain</b> close links between industry and schools.



manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. The skills needed to <b>manage</b> a young dynamic team.
militate	Have force or influence; bring about an effect or change. These fundamental differences will <b>militate</b> against the two communities coming together.
moderating	Lessening in intensity or strength.
<u>pierce</u>	14th President of the United States (1804-1869. I <b>pierce</b> d my nose and ears.
predispose	Make someone liable or inclined to a specified attitude, action, or condition. <i>This illness <b>predispose</b>s you to gain weight.</i>
press	Press from a plastic. The incident was not reported in the <b>press</b> .
pressure	The act of pressing the exertion of pressure. The compressed gas exerts an increased <b>pressure</b> .
punch	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. I <b>punch</b> ed the button to summon the lift.
<u>push</u>	Make strenuous pushing movements during birth to expel the baby. The Dean is <b>push</b> ing for his favorite candidate.
pushing	The act of applying force in order to move something away. <i>The <b>pushing</b> is good exercise.</i>
<u>shove</u>	The act of shoving (giving a push to someone or something. I should have told the boss to <b>shove</b> it.
suggestible	Open to suggestion; easily swayed. A <b>suggestible</b> client would comply.
<u>systemic</u>	(of an insecticide, fungicide, or similar substance) entering the plant via the roots or shoots and passing through the tissues. <i>The disease is localized rather than</i> <b>systemic</b> .
wangle	An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation. A rather clever <b>wangle</b> on the part of some of the folk at the office.
wield	Have and exercise. A masked raider <b>wield</b> ing a handgun.
