elated	Ecstatically happy. <i>Dozens of elated fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
enjoyable	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
enraptured	Feeling great rapture or delight.
euphoric	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A euphoric sense of freedom.</i>
exaltation	The action of praising someone or something highly. <i>The exaltation of the army as a place for brotherhood.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>One of the most exciting matches I ve ever seen.</i>
expansive	Tending towards economic or political expansion. <i>An expansive lifestyle.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
exultation	The utterance of sounds expressing great joy. <i>She laughs in exultation.</i>
fascinated	Strongly attracted and interested. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
glad	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <i>Gave a glad shout.</i>
gratifying	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The results were gratifying.</i>
happy	Fortunate and convenient. <i>I can t say they looked too happy about it but a deal s a deal.</i>
joy	Feel happiness or joy. <i>The joys of country living.</i>
joyful	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Joyful music.</i>
joyous	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Joyous laughter.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merry	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>The streets were dense with merry throngs of students.</i>

pleased Willing or glad to do something.
*Both girls were **pleased** with their new hairstyles.*

rapt Feeling great rapture or delight.
*A **rapt** teenage audience.*

rapture (according to some millenarian teaching) the transporting of believers to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ.
*Leonora listened with **rapture**.*

rapturous Feeling great rapture or delight.
*He was greeted with **rapturous** applause.*

rejoicing A feeling of great happiness.
***Rejoicing** crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.*

stimulating Rousing or quickening activity or the senses.
*A **stimulating** discussion.*
