**elating** Making lively and joyful.

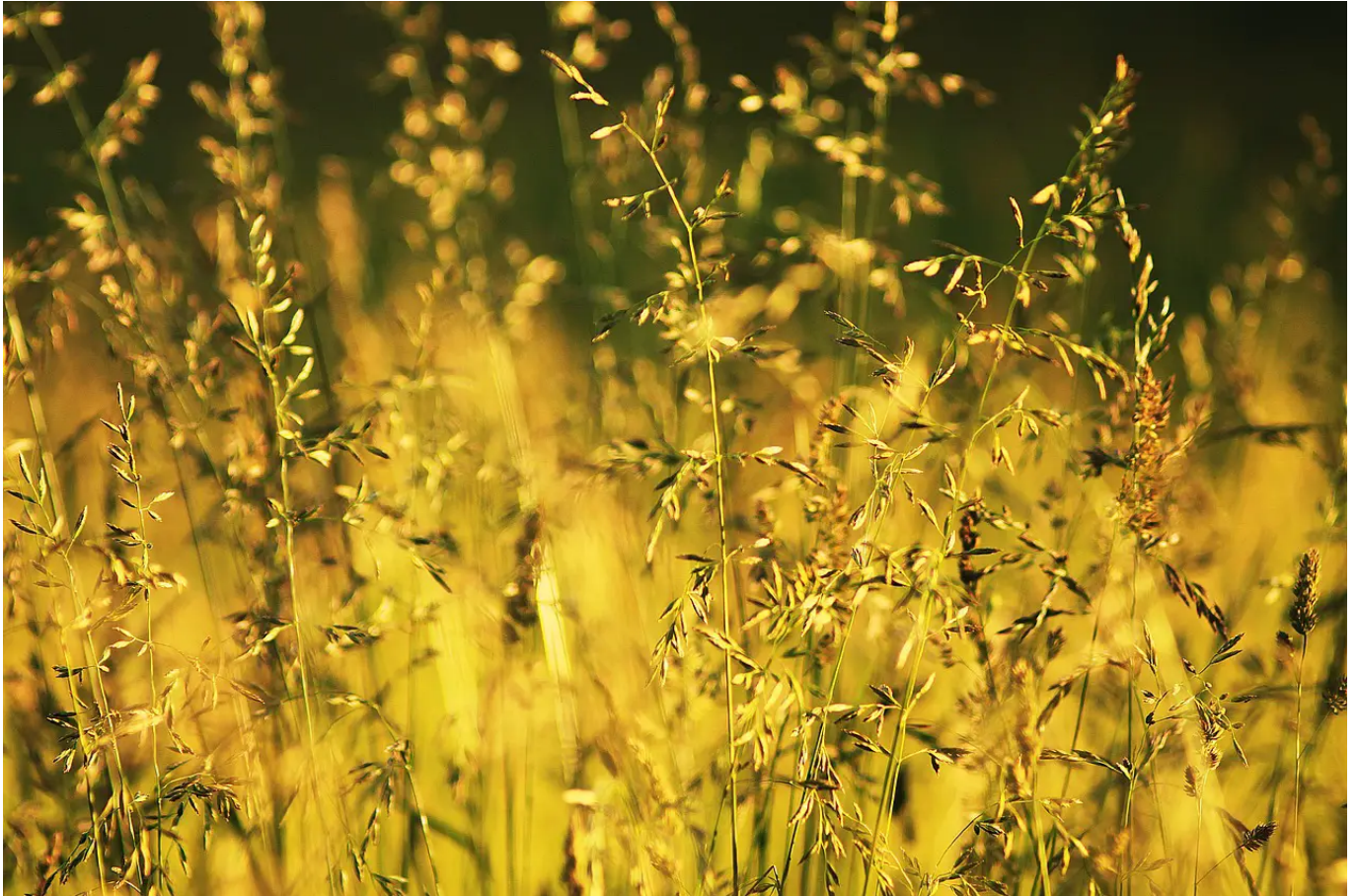
**stimulating** Rousing or quickening activity or the senses.

<b>blissful</b>	Providing perfect happiness or great joy. <i>In <b>blissful</b> ignorance.</i>
<b>cheering</b>	Providing freedom from worry. <i>A <b>cheering</b> crowd.</i>
<b>contentment</b>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Feeling or showing great pleasure. <i>A <b>delighted</b> smile.</i>
<b>delightful</b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>A <b>delightful</b> secluded garden.</i>
<b>ecstatic</b>	Feeling or expressing overwhelming happiness or joyful excitement. <i><b>Ecstatic</b> fans filled the stadium.</i>

<b>elated</b>	Ecstatically happy. <i>Dozens of <b>elated</b> fans welcomed the champions home.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>enraptured</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
<b>euphoric</b>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.</i>
<b>exaltation</b>	The action of praising someone or something highly. <i>The <b>exaltation</b> of the army as a place for brotherhood.</i>
<b>exciting</b>	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>One of the most <b>exciting</b> matches I've ever seen.</i>
<b>expansive</b>	Tending towards economic or political expansion. <i>An <b>expansive</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>exultation</b>	The utterance of sounds expressing great joy. <i>She laughs in <b>exultation</b>.</i>
<b>fascinated</b>	Strongly attracted and interested. <i>A crowd of <b>fascinated</b> onlookers.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <i>Gave a <b>glad</b> shout.</i>
<b>gratifying</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The results were <b>gratifying</b>.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Fortunate and convenient. <i>I can't say they looked too <b>happy</b> about it but a deal's a deal.</i>
<b>joy</b>	Feel happiness or joy. <i>The <b>joys</b> of country living.</i>
<b>joyful</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i><b>Joyful</b> music.</i>
<b>joyous</b>	Full of happiness and joy. <i><b>Joyous</b> laughter.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>merry</b>	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>The streets were dense with <b>merry</b> throngs of students.</i>

**pleased**

Willing or glad to do something.  
*Both girls were **pleased** with their new hairstyles.*

**rapt**

Feeling great rapture or delight.  
*A **rapt** teenage audience.*

**rapture**

(according to some millenarian teaching) the transporting of believers to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ.  
*Leonora listened with **rapture**.*

**rapturous**

Feeling great rapture or delight.  
*He was greeted with **rapturous** applause.*

**rejoicing**

A feeling of great happiness.  
***Rejoicing** crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.*

**stimulating**

Rousing or quickening activity or the senses.  
*A **stimulating** discussion.*
