impulsion The act of applying force suddenly.

In an impulsive or impetuous way; without taking cautions.

Instant coffee.

instantaneous Existing or measured at a particular instant.

Modern methods of **instantaneous** communication.

instantly Without any delay.

She fell asleep almost **instantly**.

offhand With little or no preparation or forethought.

pressingThe act of pressing the exertion of pressure.

promptThe time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note.
