<b>biologically</b>	With respect to biology. <i><b>Biologically</b> rooted instincts.</i>

<b><u>creature</u></b>	A person or organization considered to be under the complete control of another. <i>As fellow <b>creatures</b> on this planet animals deserve respect.</i>
<b><u> dwell</u></b>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>This kind of fish <b>dwells</b> near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
<b><u>empirical</u></b>	Based on, concerned with, or verifiable by observation or experience rather than theory or pure logic. <i><b>Empirical</b> data.</i>
<b>existence</b>	Something that exists; a being. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous <b>existences</b>.</i>
<b>existing</b>	Presently existing. <i>Depletion of the oxygen <b>existing</b> in the bloodstream.</i>
<b><u>experimental</u></b>	Based on experience as opposed to authority or conjecture. <i><b>Experimental</b> results.</i>
<b><u>extant</u></b>	Still in existence; not extinct or destroyed or lost. <i><b>Extant</b> manuscripts.</i>
<b>humankind</b>	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. <i>The origin of <b>humankind</b>.</i>
<b><u>incarnation</u></b>	With reference to reincarnation each of a series of earthly lifetimes. <i>The pub has gone through several <b>incarnations</b>.</i>
<b><u>inhabit</u></b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>The people <b>inhabited</b> the islands that are now deserted.</i>
<b><u>lifelong</u></b>	Continuing through life. <i>A <b>lifelong</b> friend.</i>
<b>live</b>	Continue to live and avoid dying. <i>The holocaust survivors have <b>lived</b> a nightmare.</i>
<b><u>living</u></b>	Of a place used for living rather than working in. <i>Save your pity for the <b>living</b>.</i>
<b>observational</b>	Drawing on things that one has seen, heard, or noticed in everyday life. <i>Our study was purely <b>observational</b>.</i>
<b><u>organism</u></b>	The material structure of an organism. <i>The heart s contribution to the maintenance of the human <b>organism</b>.</i>
<b>outlast</b>	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will <b>outlast</b> youth.</i>
<b>outlive</b>	(of a person) live longer than (another person). <i>The world has <b>outlived</b> much.</i>



<b>philosophy</b>	Any personal belief about how to live or how to deal with a situation. <i>The <b>philosophy</b> of science.</i>
<b>physiology</b>	Processes and functions of an organism. <i>The <b>physiology</b> of the brain.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Form the population of (a place). <i>The film is an epic fantasy <b>populated</b> by grotesque weirdos.</i>
<b>positivism</b>	A humanistic religious system founded on positivism.
<u><b>presence</b></u>	Dignified manner or conduct. <i>My <b>presence</b> in the flat made her happy.</i>
<u><b>recreate</b></u>	Create anew. <i>He <b>recreated</b> Mallory's 1942 climb for TV.</i>
<u><b>verifiable</b></u>	Able to be checked or demonstrated to be true, accurate, or justified. <i>A <b>verifiable</b> account of the incident.</i>
