<u>creature</u>	A person or organization considered to be under the complete control of another. <i>As fellow creatures on this planet animals deserve respect.</i>
<u> dwell</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>This kind of fish dwells near the bottom of the ocean.</i>
<u>empirical</u>	Based on, concerned with, or verifiable by observation or experience rather than theory or pure logic. <i>Empirical data.</i>
existence	Something that exists; a being. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous existences.</i>
existing	Presently existing. <i>Depletion of the oxygen existing in the bloodstream.</i>
<u>experimental</u>	Based on experience as opposed to authority or conjecture. <i>Experimental results.</i>
<u>extant</u>	Still in existence; not extinct or destroyed or lost. <i>Extant manuscripts.</i>
humankind	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. <i>The origin of humankind.</i>
<u>incarnation</u>	With reference to reincarnation each of a series of earthly lifetimes. <i>The pub has gone through several incarnations.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>The people inhabited the islands that are now deserted.</i>
<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. <i>A lifelong friend.</i>
live	Continue to live and avoid dying. <i>The holocaust survivors have lived a nightmare.</i>
<u>living</u>	Of a place used for living rather than working in. <i>Save your pity for the living.</i>
observational	Drawing on things that one has seen, heard, or noticed in everyday life. <i>Our study was purely observational.</i>
<u>organism</u>	The material structure of an organism. <i>The heart's contribution to the maintenance of the human organism.</i>
outlast	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will outlast youth.</i>
outlive	(of a person) live longer than (another person). <i>The world has outlived much.</i>

philosophy	Any personal belief about how to live or how to deal with a situation. <i>The philosophy of science.</i>
physiology	Processes and functions of an organism. <i>The physiology of the brain.</i>
populate	Form the population of (a place). <i>The film is an epic fantasy populated by grotesque weirdos.</i>
positivism	A humanistic religious system founded on positivism.
<u>presence</u>	Dignified manner or conduct. <i>My presence in the flat made her happy.</i>
<u>recreate</u>	Create anew. <i>He recreated Mallory's 1942 climb for TV.</i>
<u>verifiable</u>	Able to be checked or demonstrated to be true, accurate, or justified. <i>A verifiable account of the incident.</i>
