Synonyms of "Expanse" as a noun (14 Words)

- area** The extent or measurement of a surface or piece of land.
*It was his **area** of specialization.*
- belt** A belt worn as a sign of rank or achievement.
*He was awarded the victor s **belt**.*
- dimensions** One of three Cartesian coordinates that determine a position in space.
Fielders collectively or the manner in which they are spread over the pitch.
- field** *Fifty white stars on a blue **field**.*
- magnitude** A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10.
*The **magnitudes** of all the economic variables could be determined.*

- wide** A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side.
*He played in a **wide** left position.*
- wingspan** The maximum extent across the wings of an aircraft or of a bird or other flying animal, measured from tip to tip.
*An eagle with a **wingspan** of 7 ft.*
