disconcerted	Unsettled or confused. <i>Looked at each other dumbly quite disconcerted.</i>
effective	Able to accomplish a purpose functioning effectively. <i>Effective teaching methods.</i>
effectively	In such a manner as to achieve a desired result. <i>They were effectively controlled by the people they were supposed to be investigating.</i>
efficient	Being effective without wasting time or effort or expense. <i>The efficient cause of the revolution.</i>
efficiently	With efficiency; in an efficient manner. <i>They recycle waste cheaply and efficiently.</i>
expeditious	Marked by speed and efficiency. <i>An expeditious investigation.</i>
fast	So as to be hard to wake. <i>A wide fast road.</i>
favorably	Showing approval. <i>He reviewed the play favorably.</i>
hastily	With excessive speed or urgency; hurriedly. <i>He hastily changed the subject.</i>
hurriedly	In a quick or rushed manner. <i>The way they buried him so hurriedly was disgraceful.</i>
overrun	A clear area beyond the end of a runway. <i>Let the text overrun the right hand margin.</i>
proceed	Follow a certain course. <i>Opposite the front door was a staircase which I proceeded to climb.</i>
promptly	At once (usually modifies an undesirable occurrence). <i>He did his homework promptly.</i>
quick	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>Was quick to respond.</i>
quickly	With little or no delay; promptly. <i>We moved quickly to deal with our auditor's questions.</i>
rapid	(of an action) characterized by great speed. <i>They lost three wickets in rapid succession.</i>
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The business is expanding rapidly.</i>

rush	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>A rush job.</i>
satisfactorily	In a satisfactory manner. <i>The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.</i>
scribble	Write for a living or as a hobby. <i>He took the clipboard and scribbled something illegible.</i>
smoothly	Without problems or difficulties. <i>Everything seemed to be going smoothly.</i>
<u>speed</u>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>The course is delivered online so students can progress at their own speed.</i>
speedily	With speed. <i>Your claim will be dealt with as speedily as possible.</i>
successfully	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has successfully completed her mission.</i>
<u>swift</u>	Swiftly. <i>Swift flight of an arrow.</i>
<u>swiftly</u>	At high speed; quickly. <i>She got up and walked swiftly to the door.</i>
telling	Producing a strong effect. <i>A telling gesture.</i>
