Synonyms of "Experiential" as an adjective (6 Words)

<u>actual</u>	Taking place in reality; not pretended or imitated. <i>The book could be condensed into half the space but what of the actual content.</i>
<u>existential</u>	Of or as conceived by existentialism. <i>Formal logicians are not concerned with existential matters.</i>
factual	Actually occurring. <i>Cases mentioned are factual.</i>
observed	Discovered or determined by scientific observation. <i>No explanation for the observed phenomena.</i>

- real** Coinciding with reality.
*To the man sleeping regularly in doorways homelessness is **real**.*
- verifiable** Able to be checked or demonstrated to be true, accurate, or justified.
*There is not a single **verifiable** fact.*

Usage Examples of "Experiential" as an adjective

- *The experiential learning associated with employment.*
- *The rich experiential content of the teachings of the older philosophers.*
