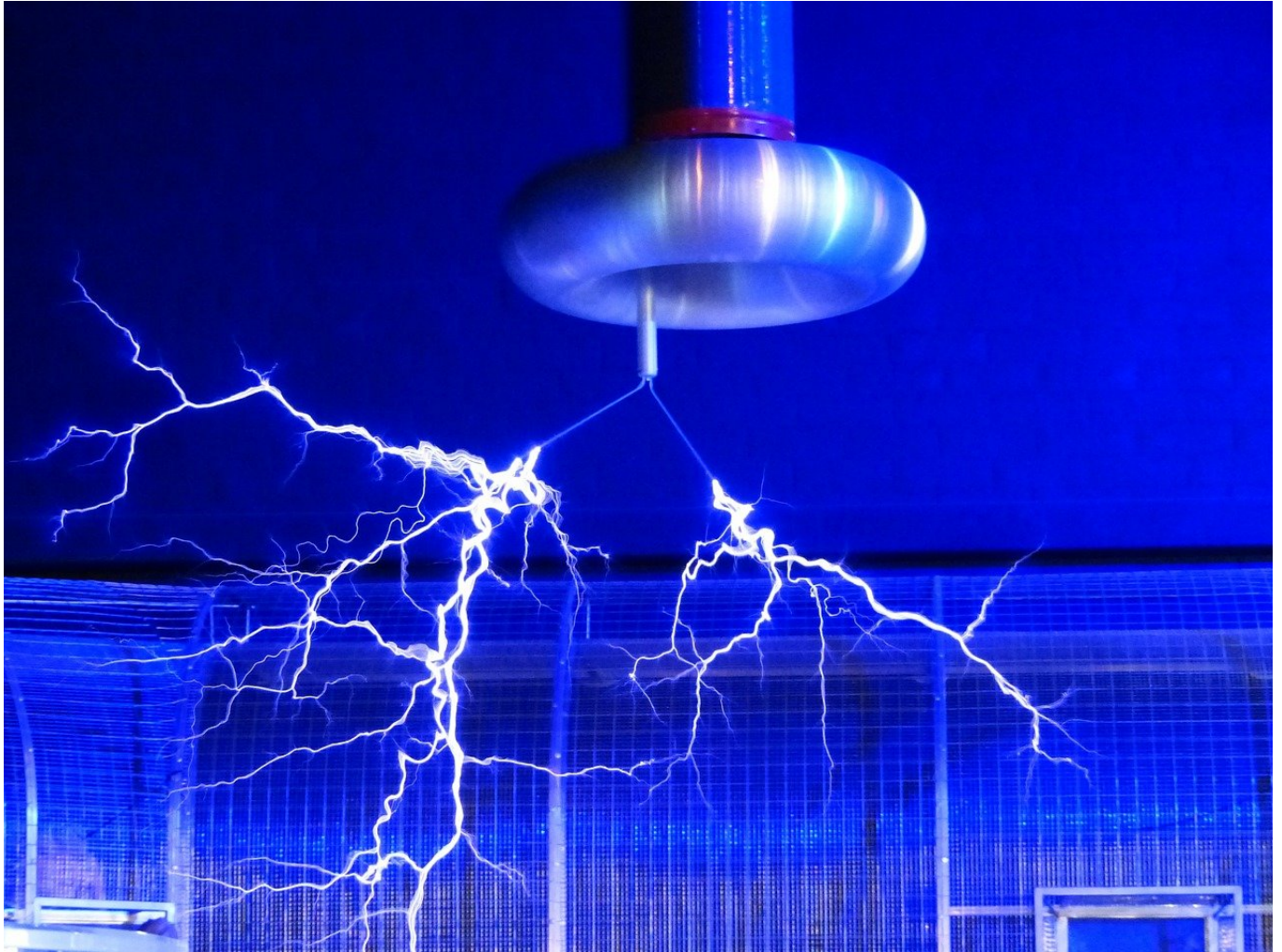

Definitions of "Experimentation" as a noun

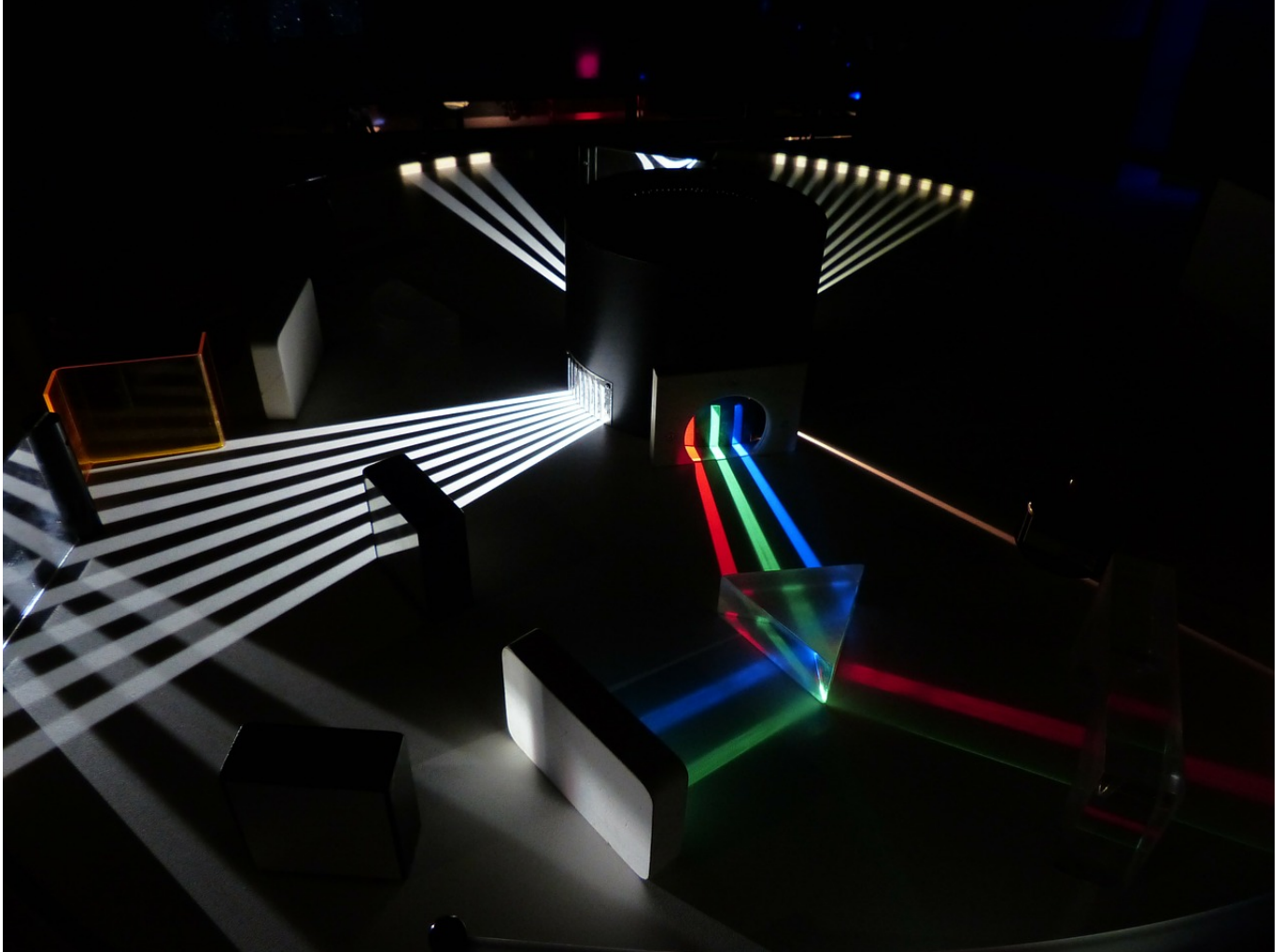
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “experimentation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The act of conducting a controlled test or investigation.*
- *The testing of an idea.*

biochemistry	The processes and substances with which the science of biochemistry is concerned. <i>Abnormal brain biochemistry.</i>
biomedical	Relating to the activities and applications of science to clinical medicine.
colloid	Relating to or characterized by a colloid or colloids.
electrical	Shares in companies manufacturing electrical goods. <i>An electrical storm.</i>
engineering	The action of working artfully to bring something about. <i>If not for his shrewd engineering the election would have been lost.</i>
galvanism	Electricity produced by chemical action.
galvanize	Galvanized steel sheeting typically as used for roofing or fencing. <i>They promised they would galvanize the iron railings to prevent rusting.</i>

industrial	Shares in industrial companies. <i>The major industrial nations.</i>
industry	Hard work. <i>Each industry has its own trade publications.</i>
lab	A laboratory. <i>A science lab.</i>
<u>laboratory</u>	A region resembling a laboratory inasmuch as it offers opportunities for observation and practice and experimentation. <i>Laboratory tests.</i>
machinery	Machines collectively. <i>The complex machinery of negotiation.</i>
medicinal	A medicinal substance. <i>Medicinal herbs.</i>
metallurgical	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i>Metallurgical engineer.</i>
<u>microcosm</u>	A miniature model of something. <i>The city is a microcosm of modern Malaysia.</i>
petrochemical	A chemical obtained from petroleum and natural gas. <i>A huge petrochemical works producing plastics.</i>
production	The act of exhibiting in a court of law. <i>Shakespeare s production of poetry was enormous.</i>
rat	Give hair the appearance of being fuller by using a rat. <i>We would always take a terrier when we fished and the terrier ratted away.</i>
reactant	A chemical substance that is present at the start of a chemical reaction.
researcher	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>Radio and TV researchers.</i>
result	Have as a result or residue. <i>The tower collapsed as a result of safety violations.</i>
robotics	The branch of technology that deals with the design, construction, operation, and application of robots. <i>Civilian research on robotics is advancing swiftly.</i>
science	A particular area of science. <i>The world of science and technology.</i>
scientific	Based on or characterized by the methods and principles of science. <i>Scientific instruments.</i>

- scientist** A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences.
*A research **scientist**.*
- substation** A subordinate station for the police or fire service.
- technical** A pickup truck with a gun mounted on it.
*The fall is only a **technical** correction.*
- technique** A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure.
*New surgical **techniques** mean a shorter hospital stay.*
- technology** Machinery and equipment developed from engineering or other applied sciences.
*The mastery of fire was a huge advance in human **technology**.*
- vivisection** Ruthlessly sharp and detailed criticism or analysis.
*The abolition of **vivisection**.*
