### **Definitions of "Experimentation" as a noun**

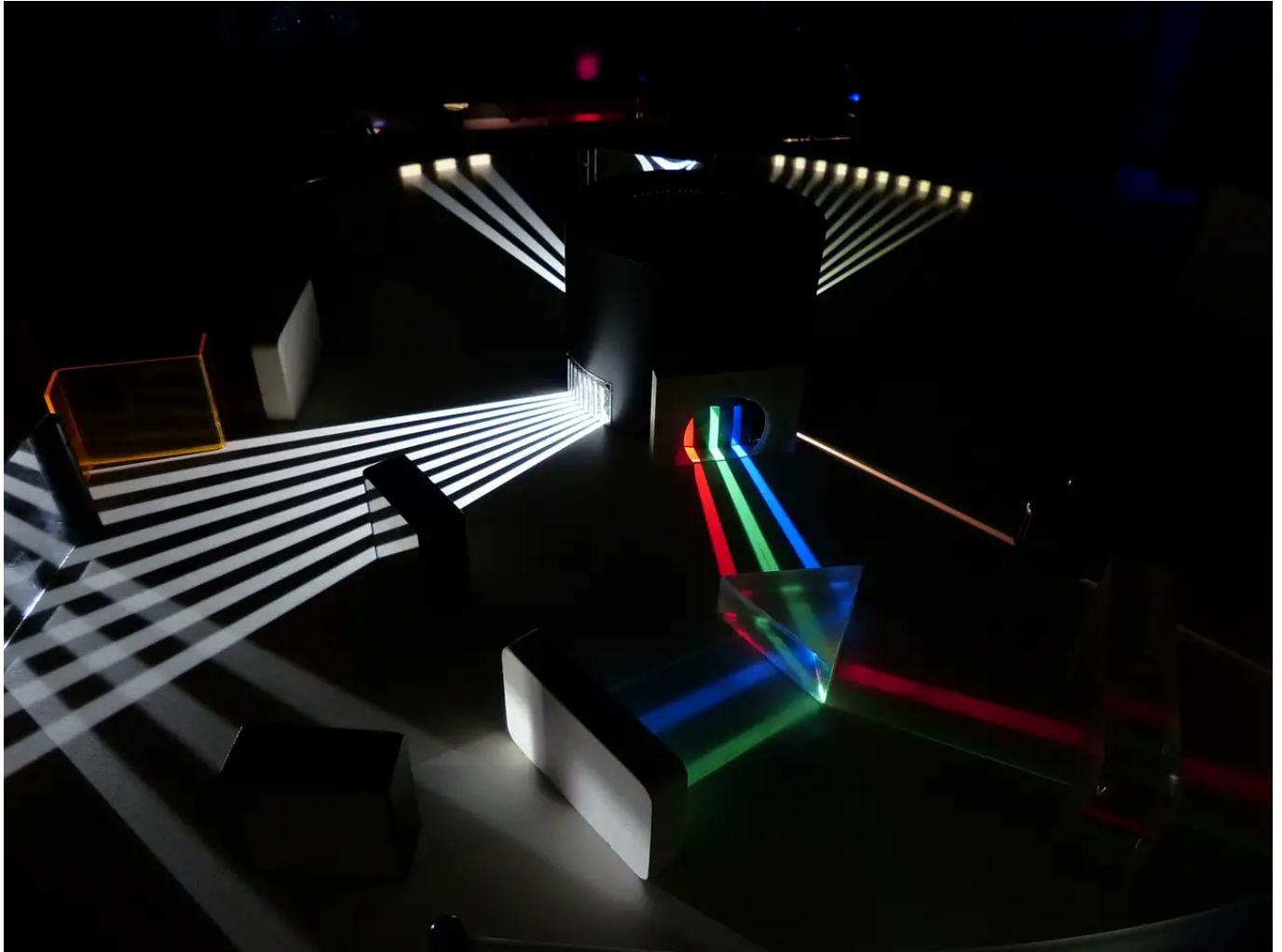
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “experimentation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

<b>biomedical</b>	Relating to the activities and applications of science to clinical medicine.
<b>colloid</b>	Relating to or characterized by a colloid or colloids.
<b>electrical</b>	Shares in companies manufacturing electrical goods. <i>An <b>electrical</b> storm.</i>
<b><u>engineering</u></b>	The action of working artfully to bring something about. <i>If not for his shrewd <b>engineering</b> the election would have been lost.</i>
<b>galvanism</b>	Electricity produced by chemical action.
<b><u>galvanize</u></b>	Galvanized steel sheeting typically as used for roofing or fencing. <i>They promised they would <b>galvanize</b> the iron railings to prevent rusting.</i>

<b>industrial</b>	Shares in industrial companies. <i>The major <b>industrial</b> nations.</i>
<b>industry</b>	Hard work. <i>Each <b>industry</b> has its own trade publications.</i>
<b>lab</b>	A laboratory. <i>A science <b>lab</b>.</i>
<b><u>laboratory</u></b>	A region resembling a laboratory inasmuch as it offers opportunities for observation and practice and experimentation. <i><b>Laboratory</b> tests.</i>
<b>machinery</b>	Machines collectively. <i>The complex <b>machinery</b> of negotiation.</i>
<b>medicinal</b>	A medicinal substance. <i><b>Medicinal</b> herbs.</i>
<b>metallurgical</b>	Of or relating to metallurgy. <i><b>Metallurgical</b> engineer.</i>
<b><u>microcosm</u></b>	A miniature model of something. <i>The city is a <b>microcosm</b> of modern Malaysia.</i>
<b>petrochemical</b>	A chemical obtained from petroleum and natural gas. <i>A huge <b>petrochemical</b> works producing plastics.</i>
<b>production</b>	The act of exhibiting in a court of law. <i>Shakespeare s <b>production</b> of poetry was enormous.</i>
<b>rat</b>	Give hair the appearance of being fuller by using a rat. <i>We would always take a terrier when we fished and the terrier <b>ratted</b> away.</i>
<b>reactant</b>	A chemical substance that is present at the start of a chemical reaction.
<b>researcher</b>	A scientist who devotes himself to doing research. <i>Radio and TV <b>researchers</b>.</i>
<b>result</b>	Have as a result or residue. <i>The tower collapsed as a <b>result</b> of safety violations.</i>
<b>robotics</b>	The branch of technology that deals with the design, construction, operation, and application of robots. <i>Civilian research on <b>robotics</b> is advancing swiftly.</i>
<b>science</b>	A particular area of science. <i>The world of <b>science</b> and technology.</i>
<b>scientific</b>	Based on or characterized by the methods and principles of science. <i><b>Scientific</b> instruments.</i>



<b><u>scientist</u></b>	A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences. <i>A research <b>scientist</b>.</i>
<b>substation</b>	A subordinate station for the police or fire service.
<b><u>technical</u></b>	A pickup truck with a gun mounted on it. <i>The fall is only a <b>technical</b> correction.</i>
<b>technique</b>	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>New surgical <b>techniques</b> mean a shorter hospital stay.</i>
<b>technology</b>	Machinery and equipment developed from engineering or other applied sciences. <i>The mastery of fire was a huge advance in human <b>technology</b>.</i>
<b>vivisection</b>	Ruthlessly sharp and detailed criticism or analysis. <i>The abolition of <b>vivisection</b>.</i>
