Definitions of "Exposition" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “exposition” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The action of making something public.*
- *A large public exhibition of art or trade goods.*
- *An account that sets forth the meaning or intent of a writing or discourse.*
- *The section of a movement (especially in sonata form) where the major musical themes first occur.*
- *A collection of things (goods or works of art etc.) for public display.*
- *(music) the section of a movement (especially in sonata form) where the major musical themes first occur.*
- *The part of a movement, especially in sonata form, in which the principal themes are first presented.*
- *A systematic interpretation or explanation (usually written) of a specific topic.*
- *A comprehensive description and explanation of an idea or theory.*



Synonyms of "Exposition" as a noun (15 Words)

- demonstration** A public display of group feelings (usually of a political nature).
*There were violent **demonstrations** against the war.*
- description** The act of describing something.
*People who had seen him were able to give a **description**.*
- display** Exhibiting openly in public view.
*A **display** of fireworks.*
- elucidation** Explanation that makes something clear; clarification.
*Work that led to the **elucidation** of the structure of proteins.*
- exhibition** A scholarship awarded to a student at a school or university, usually after a competitive examination.
*A remarkable **exhibition** of musicianship.*

explanation	A reason or justification given for an action or belief. <i>I heard his explanation of the accident.</i>
explication	The process of analysing and developing an idea or principle in detail. <i>Careful reading and explication of classical texts.</i>
expo	A large international exhibition.
expounding	A systematic interpretation or explanation (usually written) of a specific topic.
fair	A traveling show; having sideshows and rides and games of skill etc. <i>Pursuing his fair in a solitary street.</i>
illustration	An item of information that is typical of a class or group. <i>This accident is a graphic illustration of the disaster that s waiting to happen.</i>
<u>interpretation</u>	An explanation or way of explaining. <i>His unique interpretation of the Liszt tudes.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>After her presentation to Queen Victoria he had escorted his sister to numerous balls.</i>
show	A social event involving a public performance or entertainment. <i>I man a desk in a little office I don t run the show.</i>
trade fair	The commercial exchange (buying and selling on domestic or international markets) of goods and services.



Usage Examples of "Exposition" as a noun

- *We would have understood the play better if there had been some initial exposition of the background.*
- *A systematic exposition of the idea of biodiversity.*
- *The country squires dreaded the exposition of their rustic conversation.*
- *The exposition will feature exhibits by 165 companies.*

- clarification** The act of removing solid particles from a liquid.
*The professor's **clarification** helped her to understand the textbook.*
- clarify** Melt (butter) in order to separate out the water and milk solids.

- define** Give a definition for the meaning of a word.
*The camera could **define** the smallest object.*
- definition** A statement of the exact meaning of a word, especially in a dictionary.
*Exercise had given his muscles superior **definition**.*
- depict** Portray in words; describe.
*These equations may be **depicted** on a graph.*
- depiction** The action of depicting something, especially in a work of art.
*Michelangelo's **depictions** of the male nude.*
- describe** To give an account or representation of in words.
*A single light is seen to **describe** a circle.*

<u>descriptive</u>	Describing accents, forms, structures, and usage without making value judgements. <i>The text contains some good descriptive passages.</i>
display	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>A display of emotion.</i>
<u>elucidate</u>	Make (something) clear; explain. <i>In what follows I shall try to elucidate what I believe the problems to be.</i>
<u>exhibition</u>	A collection of things (goods or works of art etc.) for public display. <i>A remarkable exhibition of musicianship.</i>
expatiate	Speak or write in detail about. <i>She expatiated on working class novelists.</i>
explain	Define. <i>He explained the laws of physics to his students.</i>
explanation	A reason or justification given for an action or belief. <i>I heard his explanation of the accident.</i>
explicate	Elaborate, as of theories and hypotheses. <i>An attempt to explicate the relationship between crime and economic forces.</i>
<u>expose</u>	Expose or make accessible to some action or influence. <i>The situation exposed a conflict within the government.</i>
expository	Intended to explain or describe something. <i>Clean expository writing.</i>
expound	Explain the meaning of (a literary or doctrinal work). <i>He was expounding a powerful argument.</i>
forum	A public facility to meet for open discussion. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
<u>gallery</u>	A porch along the outside of a building (sometimes partly enclosed). <i>In the minstrels gallery a string orchestra plays themes from film soundtracks.</i>
homily	A religious discourse which is intended primarily for spiritual edification rather than doctrinal instruction. <i>She delivered her homily about the need for patience.</i>
instruction	Directions to a solicitor or counsel, or to a jury. <i>He issued instructions to the sheriff.</i>
<u>interpret</u>	Give an interpretation or explanation to. <i>Can you interpret the speech of the visiting dignitaries.</i>

<u>interpretation</u>	An explanation or way of explaining. <i>The report included his interpretation of the forensic evidence.</i>
portray	Portray in words. <i>The father is portrayed as a good looking man in this painting.</i>
<u>preach</u>	Deliver a sermon. <i>He preached the word of God.</i>
rationale	An explanation of the fundamental reasons (especially an explanation of the working of some device in terms of laws of nature). <i>The rationale for capital punishment.</i>
<u>sermon</u>	A talk on a religious or moral subject, especially one given during a church service and based on a passage from the Bible. <i>I preached my first sermon on original sin.</i>
showcase	A glass container used to store and display items in a shop or museum or home. <i>The gallery will provide a showcase for Scotland s young photographers.</i>
signification	The message that is intended or expressed or signified. <i>Film comes closer than other forms of signification to resemblance of reality.</i>
