agonizing

Causing great physical or mental pain.
*There is an **agonizing** choice to make.*

beautiful

Delighting the senses or exciting intellectual or emotional admiration.
*She spoke in **beautiful** English.*

dainty

Affectedly dainty or refined.
*A **dainty** appetite.*

discerning

Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic.
*A **discerning** reader.*

discriminating

Showing or indicating careful judgment and discernment especially in matters of taste.
*The **discriminating** eye of the connoisseur.*

elegant	(of a scientific theory or solution to a problem) pleasingly ingenious and simple. <i>An elegant mathematical solution simple and precise and lucid.</i>
<u>excruciating</u>	Intensely painful. <i>Excruciating back pain.</i>
<u>fastidious</u>	Very attentive to and concerned about accuracy and detail. <i>The child seemed fastidious about getting her fingers dirty.</i>
<u>graceful</u>	Having or showing grace or elegance. <i>She was a tall girl slender and graceful.</i>
harrowing	Acutely distressing. <i>A harrowing film about racism and violence.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Enemy fire was intense.</i>
keen	(of prices) very low; competitive. <i>John was keen to help.</i>
lovely	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i>How lovely to see you.</i>
<u>piercing</u>	(of a sound) extremely high or loud. <i>Her piercing analysis.</i>
racking	Causing great physical or mental suffering.
recherche	Lavishly elegant and refined.
searing	Extremely hot or intense. <i>A searing pain.</i>
<u>selective</u>	Relating to or involving the selection of the most suitable or best qualified. <i>Modern pesticides are more selective in effect.</i>
<u>sensitive</u>	Being susceptible to the attitudes, feelings, or circumstances of others. <i>Sensitive to the local community and its needs.</i>
<u>severe</u>	Severely simple. <i>Severe pain.</i>
<u>sharp</u>	Having or made by a thin edge or sharp point suitable for cutting or piercing. <i>A pencil with a sharp point.</i>
tormenting	Inflicting severe physical or mental suffering. <i>Peace from his tormenting thoughts.</i>
<u>torturous</u>	Extremely painful. <i>A torturous five days of fitness training.</i>

affectation	A deliberate pretense or exaggerated display. <i>She called the room her boudoir which he thought an affectation.</i>
artistry	Creative skill or ability. <i>The artistry of the pianist.</i>
beautiful	Delighting the senses or exciting intellectual or emotional admiration. <i>What a beautiful day.</i>
bravura	Great technical skill and brilliance shown in a performance or activity. <i>A bravura performance.</i>
brushwork	An artist's distinctive technique of applying paint with a brush. <i>Canvases characterized by lively flowing brushwork.</i>
craft	An aircraft or spaceship. <i>A beautifully crafted object.</i>
craftsmanship	The quality of design and work shown in something made by hand; artistry. <i>A piece of fine craftsmanship.</i>
creativity	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
cultivated	Refined and well educated. <i>Cultivated speech.</i>
elegant	Displaying effortless beauty and simplicity in movement or execution. <i>The grand unified theory is compact and elegant in mathematical terms.</i>
enchantingly	In a bewitching manner.
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>I was fined for parking on the wrong side of the street.</i>
grace	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>Ms Pasco has graced the front pages of magazines like Elle and Vogue.</i>
mincing	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>I don't have to go through the rest of my life with that mincing voice of yours.</i>
pecuniary	Relating to or involving money. <i>He admitted obtaining a pecuniary advantage by deception.</i>

<u>pro</u>wess	Skill or expertise in a particular activity or field. <i>Her culinary prowess.</i>
recherche	Lavishly elegant and refined.
<u>re</u>fin	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i>Her voice was very low and refin</i> .
rococo	The rococo style of art decoration or architecture. <i>An exquisite gilded rococo mirror.</i>
skill	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>Training firms are already seeing a boost from companies looking to skill employees in cloud technologies.</i>
skilled	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. <i>A skilled surgeon has many years of training and experience.</i>
<u>soph</u>isticated	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A sophisticated drama.</i>
<u>taste</u>ful	Having or showing or conforming to good taste. <i>A tasteful lounge bar.</i>
<u>tech</u>nic	(basketball) a foul that can be assessed on a player or a coach or a team for unsportsmanlike conduct; does not usually involve physical contact during play. <i>Technical terms.</i>
technique	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>He has excellent technique.</i>
toolmaker	Someone skilled in making or repairing tools.
virtuosity	Great skill in music or another artistic pursuit. <i>A performance of considerable virtuosity.</i>
workmanlike	Worthy of a good workman. <i>A steady workmanlike approach.</i>
workmanship	Skill in an occupation or trade. <i>Cracks on the motorway were caused by poor workmanship.</i>
