<b>amount</b>	How much there is or how many there are of something that you can quantify. <i>The <b>amount</b> he had in cash was insufficient.</i>
<b>area</b>	A space allocated for a specific use. <i>It was a closed <b>area</b> of employment.</i>
<u><b>compass</b></u>	The enclosing limits of an area. <i>A regular heptagon cannot be constructed accurately with only ruler and <b>compass</b>.</i>
<b>degree</b>	A measure for arcs and angles. <i>A remarkable <b>degree</b> of frankness.</i>
<u><b>dimensions</b></u>	Magnitude or extent.
<u><b>expanse</b></u>	The extent of a 2-dimensional surface enclosed within a boundary. <i>The green <b>expanse</b> of the forest.</i>
<b>extensiveness</b>	Large or extensive in breadth or importance or comprehensiveness. <i>The very <b>extensiveness</b> of his power was a temptation to abuse it.</i>
<u><b>length</b></u>	The length of a swimming pool as a measure of the distance swum. <i>The surviving <b>length</b> of track.</i>
<b>level</b>	A position on a scale of intensity or amount or quality. <i>I've now reached <b>level</b> 106 on Candy Crush Saga.</i>
<u><b>magnitude</b></u>	A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10. <i>They tried to predict the <b>magnitude</b> of the explosion.</i>
<b>measurements</b>	The act or process of assigning numbers to phenomena according to a rule. <i>The <b>measurements</b> were carefully done.</i>
<b>range</b>	The set of values that a given function can take as its argument varies. <i>The <b>range</b> of the hills and valleys is nearly from north to south.</i>
<b>scale</b>	A flaky covering or deposit. <i>A spray on chemical for removing welding <b>scale</b> and heat discoloration from stainless steel.</i>
<u><b>scope</b></u>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Infrared night <b>scopes</b>.</i>
<u><b>size</b></u>	A person or garment corresponding to a particular numbered size. <i>I can never find anything in my <b>size</b>.</i>

**stretch**

The capacity of a material or garment to stretch or be stretched elasticity.  
A chauffeur driven **stretch**.

<b>amount</b>	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>An adequate <b>amount</b> of food for four people.</i>
<b>beyond</b>	After a specified time or event. <i>There was the terminal and <b>beyond</b> an endless line of warehouses.</i>
<b>breadth</b>	The distance or measurement from side to side of something; width. <i>A teacher must have a <b>breadth</b> of knowledge of the subject.</i>
<b>broad</b>	Broad in scope or content T G Winner. <i><b>Broad</b> daylight.</i>
<b>delimit</b>	Be opposite to; of angles and sides, in geometry. <i>Agreements <b>delimiting</b> fishing zones.</i>
<b>dimension</b>	Shape or form to required dimensions. <i>These techniques permit us to <b>dimension</b> the human heart.</i>
<b>even</b>	Make or become even. <i>Prepare the site then lay an <b>even</b> bed of mortar.</i>
<b>grade</b>	Assign a grade or rank to according to one's evaluation. <i>The sky <b>graded</b> from blue at the top of the shot to white on the horizon.</i>
<b>level</b>	Make level or straight. <i>The pictures were at the same <b>level</b>.</i>
<b>limit</b>	A speed limit. <i>A 30 mph <b>limit</b>.</i>
<b>magnitude</b>	A number assigned to the ratio of two quantities two quantities are of the same order of magnitude if one is less than 10 times as large as the other the number of magnitudes that the quantities differ is specified to within a power of 10. <i>About the <b>magnitude</b> of a small pea.</i>
<b>measurement</b>	The size, length, or amount of something, as established by measuring. <i>Accurate <b>measurement</b> is essential.</i>
<b>outreach</b>	The extent or length of reaching out. <i><b>Outreach</b> centres.</i>
<b>parameter</b>	(computer science) a reference or value that is passed to a function, procedure, subroutine, command, or program. <i>The <b>parameters</b> within which the media work.</i>
<b>proportion</b>	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>A building of vast <b>proportions</b>.</i>

<b>quantify</b>	Use as a quantifier. <i>Can you <b>quantify</b> your results.</i>
<b>quota</b>	(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese. <i>The removal of entry <b>quotas</b> encouraged young people to enter universities.</i>
<b>range</b>	Obtain the range of a target by adjustment after firing past it or short of it or by the use of radar or laser equipment. <i>My students <b>range</b> from very bright to dull.</i>
<b>ratio</b>	The relative magnitudes of two quantities (usually expressed as a quotient). <i>The <b>ratio</b> of average prices to average salaries is at its lowest number for years.</i>
<b>scope</b>	Set the scope of a projected undertaking. <i>Such questions go beyond the <b>scope</b> of this book.</i>
<b>size</b>	Make to a size bring to a suitable size. <i>He wears a <b>size</b> 13 shoe.</i>
<b>spectrum</b>	The components of a sound or other phenomenon arranged according to such characteristics as frequency, charge, and energy. <i>The left or the right of the political <b>spectrum</b>.</i>
<b>stratify</b>	Of seeds be germinated by stratifying. <i>The residues have begun to <b>stratify</b>.</i>
<b>stratum</b>	A group into which members of a population are divided in stratified sampling. <i>A <b>stratum</b> of flint.</i>
<b>stretch</b>	Extend or stretch out to a greater or the full length. <i><b>Stretch</b> the imagination.</i>
<b>symmetry</b>	The quality of being made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis. <i>The political <b>symmetry</b> between the two debates.</i>
<b>tier</b>	Any one of two or more competitors who tie one another. <i>A full skirt gathered into three <b>tiers</b>.</i>
<b>wide</b>	A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side. <i>Three feet <b>wide</b>.</i>
<b>widely</b>	To a large degree in nature or character (used to describe considerable variation or difference). <i>Lending policies vary <b>widely</b> between different banks.</i>
