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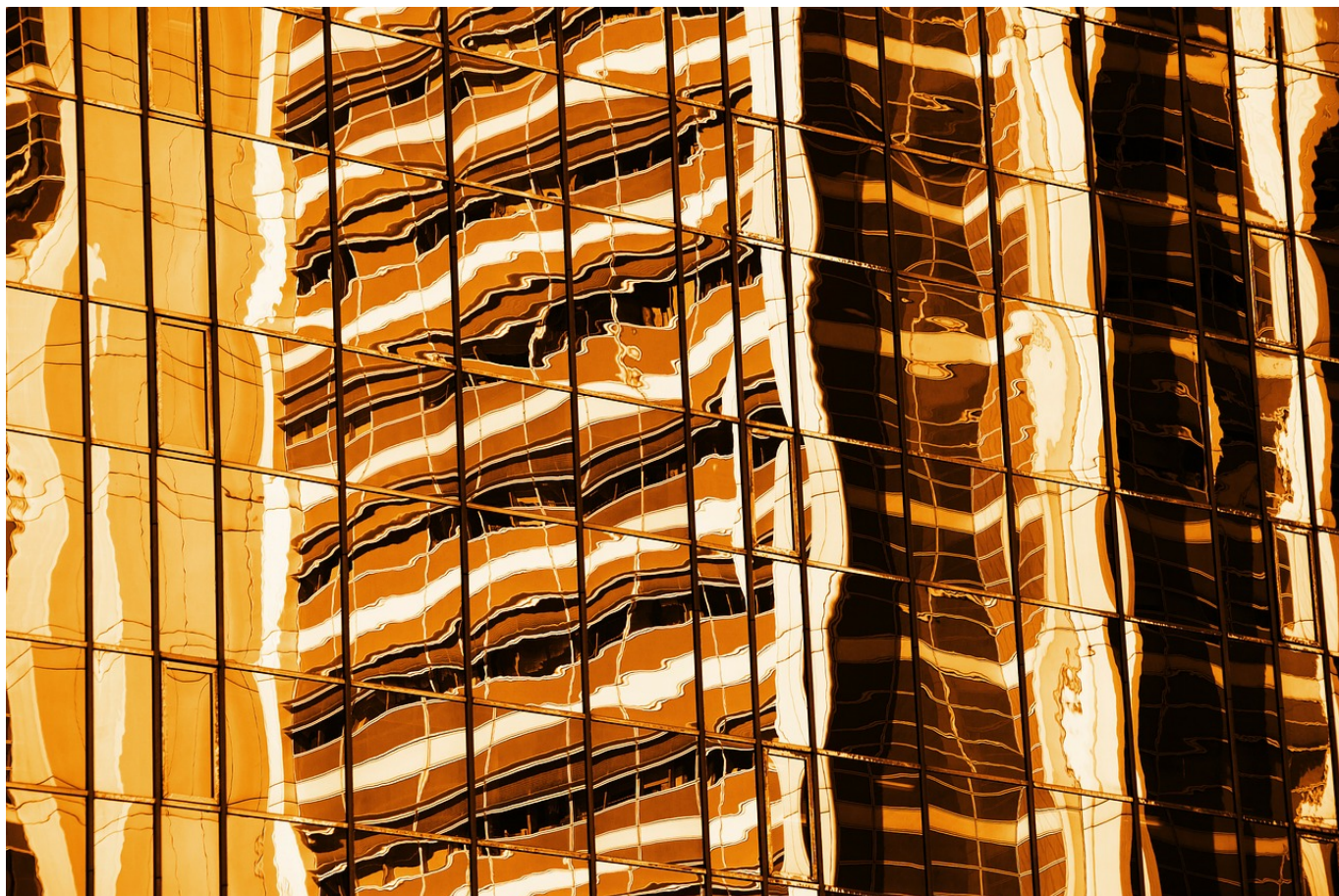

Synonyms of "Exterior" as a noun (27 Words)

character	A person seen in terms of a particular aspect of character. <i>Gas lamps give the area its character.</i>
cladding	A covering or coating on a structure or material. <i>Timber cladding.</i>
<u>coat</u>	A protective outer garment worn indoors. <i>A second coat of paint.</i>
covering	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>The sky was obscured by a covering of cloud.</i>
external surface	Outward features.
externals	Outward features. <i>He enjoyed the solemn externals of religion.</i>
<u>facade</u>	The face or front of a building. <i>Her flawless public facade masked private despair.</i>

face	The surface of a thing especially one that is presented to the view or has a particular function. <i>I wish I had seen the look on his face when he got the news.</i>
facing	A piece of material sewn on the inside of a garment, especially at the neck and armholes, to strengthen it. <i>The bricks were used as a facing on a concrete core.</i>
finish	The act of finishing. <i>A crowd assembled at the finish.</i>
finishing coat	The act of finishing.
front	The part of a garment covering a person's front. <i>He's got a bit of talent and a lot of front.</i>
guise	An artful or simulated semblance. <i>Sums paid under the guise of consultancy fees.</i>
identity	Exact sameness. <i>An identity card.</i>
image	A simile or metaphor. <i>She's the very image of her mother.</i>
lamination	A layered structure.
layer	A level of seniority in the hierarchy of an organization. <i>A managerial layer.</i>
mask	A masked person. <i>No mask could conceal his ignorance.</i>
outside	The region that is outside of something. <i>Record the date on the outside of the file.</i>
outside surface	The outer side or surface of something.
overlay	A block of code or other data transferred during the overlay process. <i>A durable cost effective floor overlay.</i>
part	The appropriate or expected behaviour in a particular role or situation one's duty. <i>In such a place his part is to make good.</i>
personality	The combination of characteristics or qualities that form an individual's distinctive character. <i>She is a Hollywood personality.</i>
public face	A body of people sharing some common interest.
role	An actor's portrayal of someone in a play. <i>He took an active role in bringing about reform.</i>

self

Used ironically to refer to oneself or someone else.

*Guilt can be turned against the **self**.*

surface

A continuous set of points that has length and breadth but no thickness.

*They skimmed over the **surface** of the water.*

- *An ideal spot to film exteriors.*
- *A jar with floral designs on the exterior.*

Definitions of "Exterior" as an adjective

- *Forming, situated on, or relating to the outside of something.*
- *Situated in or suitable for the outdoors or outside of a building.*
- *(in filming) outdoor.*
- *Coming from outside.*



Synonyms of "Exterior" as an adjective (10 Words)

- external** Coming or derived from a source outside the subject affected.
***External** pressures.*
- extrinsic** (of a muscle, such as an eye muscle) having its origin some distance from the part which it moves.
*An **extrinsic** feature of the new building.*
- open air** Of an interval that contains neither of its endpoints.
- outer** (especially in place names) more remote.
*The **outer** layer of the skin.*
- outermost** Furthest from the centre.
*The **outermost** layer of the earth.*
- outside** Coming from the outside.
*An **outside** margin.*

outward Relating to physical reality rather than with thoughts or the mind.
*The **outward** physical body.*

superficial Appearing to be true or real only until examined more closely.
***Superficial** burns.*

surface Denoting ships which travel on the surface of the water as distinct from submarines.
*The **surface** fleet.*

visible Relating to imports or exports of tangible commodities.
*A **visible** object.*

The event of coming into sight.
*The sudden **appearance** of her daughter startled her.*

An away match or win.
*Pushed all doubts **away**.*

[boundary](#)

A limit of something abstract, especially a subject or sphere of activity.
*The river marks the **boundary** between the two regions.*

by

In reserve; not for immediate use.
*Put something **by** for her old age.*

edge

Provide with an edge.
***Edge** the tablecloth with embroidery.*

epidermis	The outer layer of tissue in a plant, except where it is replaced by periderm.
<u>external</u>	Belonging to or forming the outer surface or structure of something. <i>External pressures.</i>
<u>extrinsic</u>	Not forming an essential part of a thing or arising or originating from the outside. <i>Reasons extrinsic to the music itself.</i>
<u>facade</u>	The principal front of a building, that faces on to a street or open space. <i>The house has a half timbered facade.</i>
<u>facing</u>	Positioned so as to face. <i>Two large front facing windows.</i>
lining	The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Self clean oven linings.</i>
margin	Annotate or summarize a text in the margins. <i>The notations in the margin.</i>
<u>marginal</u>	A plant that grows in water close to the edge of land. <i>The marginal tax rates on these incomes rise to as much as 80 per cent in some republics.</i>
marginally	To only a limited extent; slightly. <i>He s marginally worse than he was.</i>
outdoors	Outside a building. <i>He wanted to get outdoors a little.</i>
outer	An outer garment or part of one. <i>The outer suburbs.</i>
outermost	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. <i>The outermost layer of the earth.</i>
outrigger	A boat fitted with an outrigger.
<u>outside</u>	Outside a building. <i>An outside door.</i>
outward	Outwards. <i>An outward display of friendliness.</i>
<u>outwardly</u>	On or from the outside. <i>Outwardly featureless modern offices.</i>
peripheral	A peripheral device. <i>She will see their problems as peripheral to her own.</i>
rim	Furnish with a rim. <i>A china egg cup with a gold rim.</i>

seemingly

According to the facts as one knows them; as far as one knows.
A ***seemingly*** competent and well organized person.

side

Take sides for or against.
*There was absolutely no **side** to him.*

surface

Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground.
Surface mail.

unprepossessing

Not attractive or appealing to the eye.
*Despite his **unprepossessing** appearance he had an animal magnetism.*

veneer

Cover with veneer.
Veneer the furniture to protect it.
