
Definitions of "External" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "external" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Belonging to or forming the outer surface or structure of something.
- (of storage) using a disk or tape drive rather than the main memory.
- *Relating to or denoting a medicine or similar substance for use on the outside of the body.*
- Coming or derived from a source outside the subject affected.
- From or between other countries.
- Coming from the outside.
- For or concerning students registered with and taking the examinations of a university but not resident there.



- Purely outward or superficial- A.R.Gurney, Jr.
- (of hardware) not contained in the main computer; peripheral.
- Coming from or relating to a country or institution other than the main subject.
- Happening or arising or located outside or beyond some limits or especially surface.
- Purely outward or superficial.
