<b><a href="#">acclaim</a></b>	Praise vociferously. <i>The conference was <b>acclaimed</b> as a considerable success.</i>
<b>enthuse about</b>	Utter with enthusiasm.
<b>enthuse over</b>	Cause to feel enthusiasm.
<b>eulogize</b>	Praise highly in speech or writing. <i>He was <b>eulogized</b> as a rock star.</i>
<b>exalt</b>	Think or speak very highly of (someone or something). <i><b>Exalted</b> the humble shoemaker to the rank of King s adviser.</i>

<b>express delight over</b>	Serve as a means for expressing something.
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>Music is used to <b>glorify</b> God.</i>
<b>go into raptures about</b>	Have a particular form.
<b>go into raptures over</b>	To be spent or finished.
<b>gush about</b>	Praise enthusiastically.
<b>gush over</b>	Gush forth in a sudden stream or jet.
<b>heap praise on</b>	Arrange in stacks.
<b>laud</b>	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>The obituary <b>lauded</b> him as a great statesman and soldier.</i>
<b>praise enthusiastically</b>	Express approval of.
<b>praise to the skies</b>	Express approval of.
<b>proclaim</b>	State or announce. <i>The King will <b>proclaim</b> an amnesty.</i>
<b>rave about</b>	Participate in an all-night techno dance party.
<b>rhapsodize over</b>	Recite a rhapsody.
<b>sing the praises of</b>	Produce tones with the voice.
<b>throw bouquets at</b>	Get rid of.
<b>wax lyrical about</b>	Go up or advance.

## Associations of "Extol" (30 Words)

<b>acclaim</b>	Clap one's hands or shout after performances to indicate approval. <i>The conference was <b>acclaimed</b> as a considerable success.</i>
<b>acclamation</b>	Loud and enthusiastic approval. <i>The tackle brought the supporters to their feet in <b>acclamation</b>.</i>
<b>admire</b>	Regard with respect or warm approval. <i>I <b>admire</b> your courage.</i>
<b>adulation</b>	Servile flattery; exaggerated and hypocritical praise. <i>He found it difficult to cope with the <b>adulation</b> of the fans.</i>

<b>adulatory</b>	Excessively praising or admiring. <i>The tone here is <b>adulatory</b> and uncritical.</i>
<b><u>applaud</u></b>	Show approval or praise by clapping. <i>The crowd whistled and <b>applauded</b>.</i>
<b>applause</b>	Approval or praise expressed by clapping. <i>They gave him a round of <b>applause</b>.</i>
<b>clap</b>	Clap one's hands together. <i>The children were <b>clapping</b> to the music.</i>
<b>clapping</b>	A demonstration of approval by clapping the hands together.
<b>commend</b>	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>He was <b>commended</b> by the judge for his courageous actions.</i>
<b><u>commendable</u></b>	Deserving praise. <i>He showed <b>commendable</b> restraint.</i>
<b><u>compliment</u></b>	A polite expression of praise or admiration. <i>The manager was heard to <b>compliment</b> the other team's good play.</i>
<b>congratulate</b>	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>He had taken the chance to <b>congratulate</b> him on his marriage.</i>
<b>eclat</b>	Ceremonial elegance and splendor. <i>Entered with much <b>eclat</b> in a coach drawn by eight white horses.</i>
<b>encomium</b>	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly.
<b>enthusiastically</b>	In a lavish or enthusiastic manner. <i>The report was <b>enthusiastically</b> welcomed by all groups.</i>
<b>eulogistic</b>	Formally expressing praise.
<b>eulogize</b>	Praise highly in speech or writing. <i>A plaque that <b>eulogizes</b> the workers.</i>
<b><u>eulogy</u></b>	A formal expression of praise for someone who has died recently. <i>A <b>eulogy</b> to the Queen Mother.</i>
<b><u>flatter</u></b>	(of a colour or a style of clothing) cause (someone) to appear to the best advantage. <i>She was <b>flattering</b> him in order to avoid doing what he wanted.</i>
<b>kudos</b>	An expression of approval and commendation. <i>She was looking for <b>kudos</b> rather than profit.</i>
<b>laud</b>	Praise. <i>All glory <b>laud</b> and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
<b>laudable</b>	Worthy of high praise. <i><b>Laudable</b> though the aim might be the results have been criticized.</i>

<b>ovation</b>	Enthusiastic recognition (especially one accompanied by loud applause). <i>The performance received a thundering <b>ovation</b>.</i>
<b>paean</b>	A creative work expressing enthusiastic praise. <i>A <b>paean</b> of praise for the great poets.</i>
<b>panegyric</b>	A formal expression of praise. <i>A <b>panegyric</b> on the pleasures of malt whisky.</i>
<b>plaudit</b>	An expression of praise or approval. <i>The network has received <b>plaudits</b> for its sports coverage.</i>
<b>praise</b>	The expression of respect and gratitude as an act of worship. <i>The parents <b>praised</b> their children for their academic performance.</i>
<b>thunderous</b>	Extremely ominous. <i>Robin's <b>thunderous</b> mood hadn't lightened.</i>
<b>tribute</b>	An act, statement, or gift that is intended to show gratitude, respect, or admiration. <i>A <b>tribute</b> show.</i>
