acclaim	Praise vociferously. <i>The conference was acclaimed as a considerable success.</i>
enthuse about	Utter with enthusiasm.
enthuse over	Cause to feel enthusiasm.
eulogize	Praise highly in speech or writing. <i>He was eulogized as a rock star.</i>
exalt	Think or speak very highly of (someone or something). <i>Exalted the humble shoemaker to the rank of King s adviser.</i>

express delight over	Serve as a means for expressing something.
glorify	Praise glorify or honor. <i>Music is used to glorify God.</i>
go into raptures about	Have a particular form.
go into raptures over	To be spent or finished.
gush about	Praise enthusiastically.
gush over	Gush forth in a sudden stream or jet.
heap praise on	Arrange in stacks.
laud	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>The obituary lauded him as a great statesman and soldier.</i>
praise enthusiastically	Express approval of.
praise to the skies	Express approval of.
proclaim	State or announce. <i>The King will proclaim an amnesty.</i>
rave about	Participate in an all-night techno dance party.
rhapsodize over	Recite a rhapsody.
sing the praises of	Produce tones with the voice.
throw bouquets at	Get rid of.
wax lyrical about	Go up or advance.

Associations of "Extol" (30 Words)

acclaim	Clap one's hands or shout after performances to indicate approval. <i>The conference was acclaimed as a considerable success.</i>
acclamation	Loud and enthusiastic approval. <i>The tackle brought the supporters to their feet in acclamation.</i>
admire	Regard with respect or warm approval. <i>I admire your courage.</i>
adulation	Servile flattery; exaggerated and hypocritical praise. <i>He found it difficult to cope with the adulation of the fans.</i>

adulatory	Excessively praising or admiring. <i>The tone here is adulatory and uncritical.</i>
<u>applaud</u>	Show approval or praise by clapping. <i>The crowd whistled and applauded.</i>
applause	Approval or praise expressed by clapping. <i>They gave him a round of applause.</i>
clap	Clap one's hands together. <i>The children were clapping to the music.</i>
clapping	A demonstration of approval by clapping the hands together.
commend	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>He was commended by the judge for his courageous actions.</i>
<u>commendable</u>	Deserving praise. <i>He showed commendable restraint.</i>
<u>compliment</u>	A polite expression of praise or admiration. <i>The manager was heard to compliment the other team's good play.</i>
congratulate	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>He had taken the chance to congratulate him on his marriage.</i>
eclat	Ceremonial elegance and splendor. <i>Entered with much eclat in a coach drawn by eight white horses.</i>
encomium	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly.
enthusiastically	In a lavish or enthusiastic manner. <i>The report was enthusiastically welcomed by all groups.</i>
eulogistic	Formally expressing praise.
eulogize	Praise highly in speech or writing. <i>A plaque that eulogizes the workers.</i>
<u>eulogy</u>	A formal expression of praise for someone who has died recently. <i>A eulogy to the Queen Mother.</i>
<u>flatter</u>	(of a colour or a style of clothing) cause (someone) to appear to the best advantage. <i>She was flattering him in order to avoid doing what he wanted.</i>
kudos	An expression of approval and commendation. <i>She was looking for kudos rather than profit.</i>
laud	Praise. <i>All glory laud and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
laudable	Worthy of high praise. <i>Laudable though the aim might be the results have been criticized.</i>

ovation	Enthusiastic recognition (especially one accompanied by loud applause). <i>The performance received a thundering ovation.</i>
paean	A creative work expressing enthusiastic praise. <i>A paean of praise for the great poets.</i>
panegyric	A formal expression of praise. <i>A panegyric on the pleasures of malt whisky.</i>
plaudit	An expression of praise or approval. <i>The network has received plaudits for its sports coverage.</i>
praise	The expression of respect and gratitude as an act of worship. <i>The parents praised their children for their academic performance.</i>
thunderous	Extremely ominous. <i>Robin's thunderous mood hadn't lightened.</i>
tribute	An act, statement, or gift that is intended to show gratitude, respect, or admiration. <i>A tribute show.</i>
