## Associations of "Face to face" (30 Words)

<b>aquiline</b>	Like an eagle.
<b>brighten</b>	Make (something) more attractively colourful. <i>Most of the country should <b>brighten</b> up later.</i>
<b>careworn</b>	Tired and unhappy because of prolonged worry. <i>Looking <b>careworn</b> as she bent over her mending.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	A point of view or general attitude or inclination. <i>He altered the <b>complexion</b> of his times.</i>
<b>countenance</b>	Admit as acceptable or possible. <i>A pleasant <b>countenance</b>.</i>
<b>drawn</b>	(of a person) looking strained from illness, exhaustion, anxiety, or pain. <i>Her face was <b>drawn</b> and haggard from sleeplessness.</i>
<b>encounter</b>	A violent incident in which a suspected criminal is killed by a member of the police, especially under controversial circumstances. <i>She felt totally unnerved by the <b>encounter</b>.</i>
<b>eyebrow</b>	The strip of hair growing on the ridge above a person’s eye socket. <i>He had eyes of blue beneath bushy <b>eyebrows</b>.</i>
<b>freckle</b>	Become freckled. <i>She had a light sprinkling of <b>freckles</b> on her nose.</i>
<b>frown</b>	Furrow one’s brows in an expression indicating disapproval, displeasure, or concentration. <i>He <b>frowned</b> as he reread the letter.</i>
<b>glare</b>	Shine intensely. <i>The moon <b>glared</b> back at itself from the lake s surface.</i>
<b>glower</b>	Have an angry or sullen look on one’s face; scowl. <i>She <b>glowered</b> at him suspiciously.</i>
<b>ineluctable</b>	Unable to be resisted or avoided; inescapable. <i>An <b>ineluctable</b> destiny.</i>

<b>mien</b>	Dignified manner or conduct. <i>He has a cautious academic <b>mien</b>.</i>
<b>nasal</b>	A nasal speech sound. <i>A drawling <b>nasal</b> voice.</i>
<b>nose</b>	Push or move with the nose. <i>A dog with a keen <b>nose</b>.</i>
<b>olfaction</b>	The faculty that enables us to distinguish scents.
<b>pale</b>	Turn pale as if in fear. <i>The late afternoon light coming through the el tracks fell in <b>pale</b> oblongs on the street.</i>
<b>pallid</b>	Abnormally deficient in color as suggesting physical or emotional distress. <i><b>Pallid</b> liberalism.</i>
<b>pallor</b>	An unhealthy pale appearance. <i>The deathlike <b>pallor</b> of his face.</i>
<b>proboscis</b>	(in some worms) an extensible tubular sucking organ.
<b>sallow</b>	Cause to become sallow. <i><b>Sallow</b> faced addicts.</i>
<b>scowl</b>	Frown with displeasure. <i>She stamped into the room with a <b>scowl</b> on her face.</i>
<b>shrug</b>	An act or instance of shrugging one's shoulders. <i>She lifted her shoulders in a dismissive <b>shrug</b>.</i>
<b>sinus</b>	A wide channel containing blood; does not have the coating of an ordinary blood vessel. <i><b>Sinus</b> tachycardia.</i>
<b>smiley</b>	A symbol representing a smiling face that is used in written communication to indicate that the writer is pleased or joking. <i>He drew a <b>smiley</b> face.</i>
<b>subtend</b>	(of a line, arc, or figure) form (an angle) at a particular point when straight lines from its extremities are joined at that point. <i>The main beauty is provided by the bracts which <b>subtend</b> the flowers.</i>
<b>swarthy</b>	Dark-complexioned. <i><b>Swarthy</b> men with gleaming teeth.</i>
<b>visage</b>	The manifestation, image, or aspect of something. <i>An elegant angular <b>visage</b>.</i>
<b>wan</b>	(of a smile) lacking enthusiasm or energy. <i>She was looking <b>wan</b> and bleary eyed.</i>
