- *One side of something many-sided, especially of a cut gem.*
- *A particular aspect or feature of something.*
- *A distinct feature or element in a problem.*

- angle** Angle iron or a similar constructional material made of another metal.
*He always had a fresh **angle** on life.*
- aspect** A distinct feature or element in a problem.
*A man of decidedly foreign **aspect**.*
- characteristic** The integer part positive or negative of the representation of a logarithm in the expression $\log 6432808$ the characteristic is 2.
*Certain defining **characteristics** of the school emerge from the study.*
- detail** A small part that can be considered separately from the whole.
*The governor's security **detail**.*
- dimension** An expression for a derived physical quantity in terms of fundamental quantities such as mass length or time raised to the appropriate power acceleration for example having the dimension of length time.
*We must focus on the cultural **dimensions** of the problem.*

face	The striking or working surface of an implement. <i>An angry face.</i>
<u>factor</u>	With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified. <i>His skill was a factor in ensuring that so much was achieved.</i>
feature	A special or prominent article in a newspaper or magazine. <i>The map showed roads and other features.</i>
ingredient	Food that is a component of a mixture in cooking. <i>Mix all of the ingredients together.</i>
particular	Detailed information about someone or something. <i>He is wrong in every particular.</i>
<u>plane</u>	A power tool for smoothing or shaping wood. <i>Any line joining two points on a plane lies wholly on that plane.</i>
point	A fielder at the point position. <i>He held me up at the point of a gun.</i>
<u>side</u>	Spin given to the cue ball in snooker and billiards by hitting it on one side. <i>I would have loved to have heard his side of the argument.</i>
<u>slant</u>	A biased way of looking at or presenting something. <i>A new slant on science.</i>
<u>strand</u>	The shore of a sea, lake, or large river. <i>A strand of pearls.</i>
<u>surface</u>	The area of an outer part or uppermost layer of something. <i>Surface appearances.</i>

- angularity** The property possessed by a shape that has angles.
- aphelion** The point in the orbit of a planet, asteroid, or comet at which it is furthest from the sun.

- facade** The principal front of a building, that faces on to a street or open space.

hexagonal	Having six sides or divided into hexagons. <i>A hexagonal close packed crystal structure.</i>
homocentric	Having the same centre.
jag	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>She jagged herself in the mouth.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>A lattice fence.</i>
<u>multifaceted</u>	Having many sides. <i>The diamond s multifaceted surface.</i>
octagon	An object or building with an octagonal plan or cross section.
opinion	A statement of advice by an expert on a professional matter. <i>The solicitor took counsel s opinion.</i>
<u>outlook</u>	A habitual or characteristic mental attitude that determines how you will interpret and respond to situations. <i>The pleasant outlook from the club window.</i>
panorama	An unbroken view of the whole region surrounding an observer. <i>The galleries will offer a full panorama of 20th century art.</i>
pentagon	A plane figure with five straight sides and five angles.
pentagram	A star with 5 points; formed by 5 straight lines between the vertices of a pentagon and enclosing another pentagon.
perspective	An apparent spatial distribution in perceived sound. <i>A trick of perspective.</i>
polygon	A closed plane figure bounded by straight sides.
<u>porch</u>	A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>
preamble	The introductory part of a statute or deed, stating its purpose, aims, and justification. <i>I gave him the bad news without preamble.</i>
quadrilateral	A four-sided polygon.
rectangular	Denoting or shaped like a rectangle. <i>A neat rectangular area.</i>
<u>scope</u>	Set the scope of a projected undertaking. <i>The scope for major change is always limited by political realities.</i>
<u>side</u>	The amount of writing needed to fill one side of a sheet of paper. <i>The two sides agreed to resume border trade.</i>
<u>square</u>	Having an outline resembling two corners of a square. <i>Move the white king s pawn forward two squares.</i>

triangle	A percussion instrument consisting of a metal bar bent in the shape of an open triangle. <i>The coastline of Chile and Argentina and Brazil forms two legs of a triangle.</i>
triangulate	Divide into triangles or give a triangular form to. <i>Triangulate the piece of cardboard.</i>
vertex	The crown of the head.
view	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>The public can view the famous hall with its unique staircase.</i>
