### **Definitions of "Facets" as a noun**

**aspect** The feelings expressed on a person's face.  
*A greenhouse with a southern **aspect**.*

## Associations of "Facets" (30 Words)

- angularity** A shape having one or more sharp angles.
- aphelion** The point in the orbit of a planet, asteroid, or comet at which it is furthest from the sun.  
*Mars is at **aphelion**.*
- aspect** Of a planet form an aspect with another celestial body.  
*The sun in Aries formed an adverse **aspect** with Uranus in Capricorn.*
- facade** The face or front of a building.  
*The house has a half timbered **facade**.*
- fulcrum** The pivot about which a lever turns.  
*Research is the **fulcrum** of the academic community.*
- hexagon** A six-sided polygon.

<b>hexagonal</b>	Of or denoting a crystal system or three-dimensional geometrical arrangement having three axes of equal length separated by 60° and a fourth axis of a different length at right angles to these. <i>A <b>hexagonal</b> close packed crystal structure.</i>
<b>homocentric</b>	Having a common center.
<b>jag</b>	Cut teeth into make a jagged cutting edge. <i>She <b>jagged</b> herself in the mouth.</i>
<b>lattice</b>	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>Honeysuckle was growing up a <b>lattice</b> round the door.</i>
<b>multifaceted</b>	Having many aspects. <i>A <b>multifaceted</b> undertaking.</i>
<b>octagon</b>	An object or building with an octagonal plan or cross section.
<b>opinion</b>	The legal document stating the reasons for a judicial decision. <i>That in my <b>opinion</b> is right.</i>
<b>outlook</b>	A person's point of view or general attitude to life. <i>The deteriorating economic <b>outlook</b>.</i>
<b>panorama</b>	A picture or photograph containing a wide view. <i>The tower offers a wonderful <b>panorama</b> of Prague.</i>
<b>pentagon</b>	A five-sided polygon.
<b>pentagram</b>	A five-pointed star that is formed by drawing a continuous line in five straight segments, often used as a mystic and magical symbol.
<b>perspective</b>	The appearance of viewed objects with regard to their relative position, distance from the viewer, etc. <i>A trick of <b>perspective</b>.</i>
<b>polygon</b>	A closed plane figure bounded by straight sides.
<b>porch</b>	A veranda. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the <b>porch</b> for many hours.</i>
<b>preamble</b>	A preliminary or preparatory statement; an introduction. <i>He could tell that what she said was by way of a <b>preamble</b>.</i>
<b>quadrilateral</b>	A four-sided figure.
<b>rectangular</b>	Having four right angles. <i>A <b>rectangular</b> Cartesian coordinate system.</i>
<b>scope</b>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>Such questions go beyond the <b>scope</b> of this book.</i>
<b>side</b>	Take sides for or against siding against the current candidate. <i>Cubes with a different decoration on each of the six <b>sides</b>.</i>

<b>square</b>	A square scarf. <i>Four <b>square</b> meals a day.</i>
<b>triangle</b>	Something approximating the shape of a triangle. <i>The coastline of Chile and Argentina and Brazil forms two legs of a <b>triangle</b>.</i>
<b>triangulate</b>	Measure and map (an area) by the use of triangles with a known base length and base angles. <i>The brackets <b>triangulate</b> the frame.</i>
<b>vertex</b>	Each angular point of a polygon, polyhedron, or other figure.
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>They were soon out of <b>view</b>.</i>
