<b>appropriately</b>	In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Volunteers need to be approachable calm and able to respond <b>appropriately</b>.</i>
<b>cadre</b>	A member of an activist group. <i>He was an activist in the <b>cadre</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">career</a></b>	The time spent by a person in a career. <i>The coach <b>careered</b> across the road and went through a hedge.</i>
<b>certified</b>	Fit to be certified as insane and treated accordingly. <i>A <b>certified</b> accountant.</i>
<b>competent</b>	Acceptable and satisfactory, though not outstanding. <i>A <b>competent</b> typist.</i>
<b>consultant</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>He acted as campaign <b>consultant</b> to the president.</i>
<b><a href="#">disciplined</a></b>	Obeying the rules. <i>A <b>disciplined</b> mind.</i>
<b>domesticated</b>	Fond of home life and housework. <i>Some men think it unmanly to be <b>domesticated</b> others find gratification in it.</i>
<b>elite</b>	A group or class of persons enjoying superior intellectual or social or economic status. <i>An <b>elite</b> athlete.</i>
<b>experienced</b>	Having experience; having knowledge or skill from observation or participation. <i>An <b>experienced</b> social worker.</i>
<b><a href="#">guest</a></b>	A person staying at a hotel or guest house. <i>A <b>guest</b> speaker.</i>
<b>knowledgeable</b>	Highly educated; having extensive information or understanding. <i>She is very <b>knowledgeable</b> about livestock and pedigrees.</i>

<b>learned</b>	Showing, requiring, or characterized by learning; scholarly. <i>A <b>learned</b> jurist.</i>
<b>manpower</b>	The force of workers available. <i>The police had only limited <b>manpower</b>.</i>
<b>mason</b>	A Freemason. <i>The other building was <b>masoned</b> up out of hewn limestone.</i>
<b>medically</b>	In a way that relates to the science or practice of medicine. <i>Patients may be treated <b>medically</b> or surgically.</i>
<b>moderator</b>	In the Presbyterian church, the officer who presides over a synod or general assembly. <i>The debates will each feature one <b>moderator</b> and a panel of three questioners.</i>
<b>panelist</b>	A member of a panel.
<b>practiced</b>	Skillful after much practice. <i>A <b>practiced</b> marksman.</i>
<b>professional</b>	Worthy of or appropriate to a professional person competent skilful or assured. <i>A <b>professional</b> cook.</i>
<b>professionally</b>	As a person's paid occupation rather than on an amateur basis. <i>She has sung <b>professionally</b> with opera companies around the world.</i>
<b>qualified</b>	Holding appropriate documentation and officially on record as qualified to perform a specified function or practice a specified skill. <i>Many <b>qualified</b> applicants for the job.</i>
<b>seasoned</b>	(of wood) made suitable for use as timber by adjusting its moisture content. <i><b>Seasoned</b> flour.</i>
<b>skilled</b>	Having or showing or requiring special skill. <i>A <b>skilled</b> reconstruction of her damaged elbow.</i>
<b>specialty</b>	The special line of work you have adopted as your career.
<b>staff</b>	Provide with staff. <i>The general relied on his <b>staff</b> to make routine decisions.</i>
<b>suitably</b>	To a degree that is expected or appropriate in the circumstances. <i>The judges were <b>suitably</b> impressed.</i>
<b>trained</b>	(of a mental or physical faculty) having been developed and improved through instruction or practice. <i><b>Trained</b> volunteers provide a sympathetic ear and friendly advice.</i>
